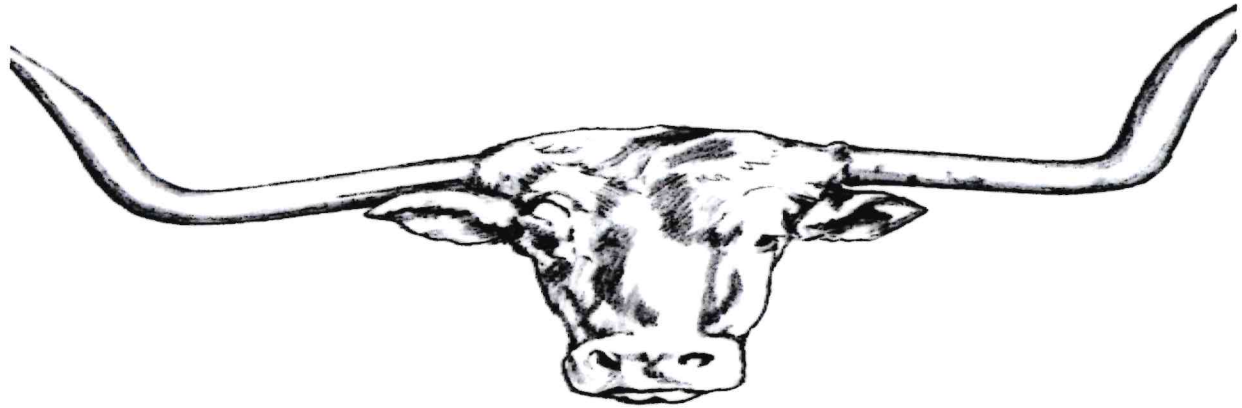

High Ability Learners:

Hyannis Area Schools has an active HAL program led by Mrs Ellie Anderson. HAL students are identified through NCSAS scores and through feedback from classroom teachers. 25% of students in grades K-8 qualify for HAL support services.

Transportation

Hyannis Area Schools has 6 local routes that travel approximately 109,374 miles throughout the 2023-2024 school year.
