




Editors' Message

... working together to honor a group of boys and their parents; it's their night, their spotlight.


Memories of a speaker, a leader, commenting, advocating, his chapter's purposes and aims.





The Senior Class consisted of fourteen students. Their president was Dave Hebbert and their sponsors were Mr. Tapley and Mr. Osborne.




The Sophomore Class was nineteen strong. They were sponsored by Mr. and Mrs. Hale and led by Debbie Schufeldt as president.








