Borman, Lovell, and Anders were the first men to orbit the moon. They orbited the moon ten times on Dec. 24-25, 1968. They get credit for being the first to see the back side of the moon. In the summer of 1969 the biggest feat ever to be accomplished by man was the first moon landing. Collins, Armstrong and Aldrin were the men to do it. Neil Armstrong will go down in history as the first man to ever stand on the moon.

We, along with all people of the world, thank these men for their work in space. Perhaps through the explorations made by these men future generations will be helped to understand the planets, their movements, and the use of astrology better than we today do.

Rhonda and her staff did an amazing job this year. They sold more advertisements than ever before and I want to thank them.

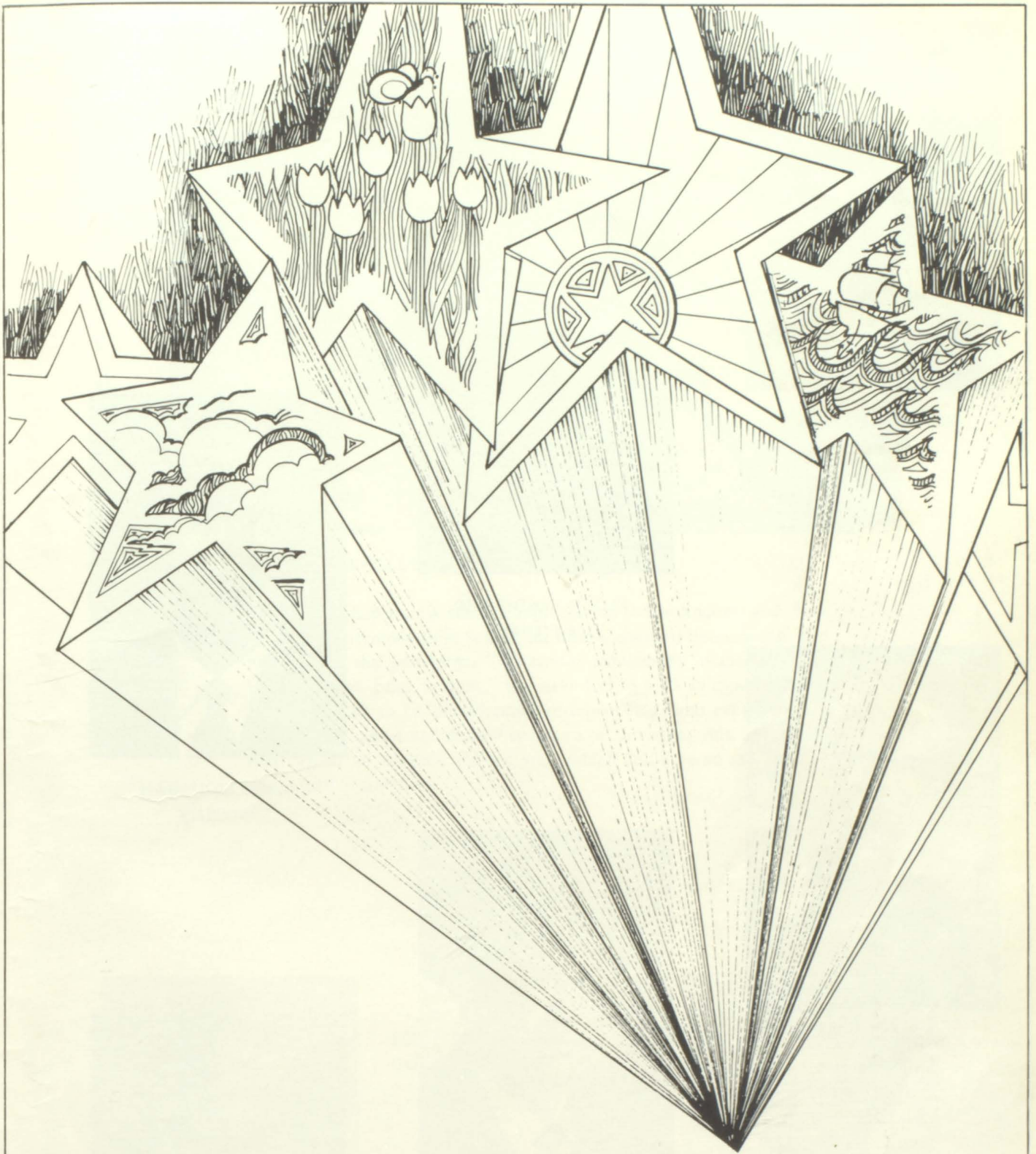

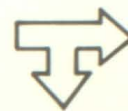


The 1969 Marching Band participated in the Homecoming Parade at Chadron State College.

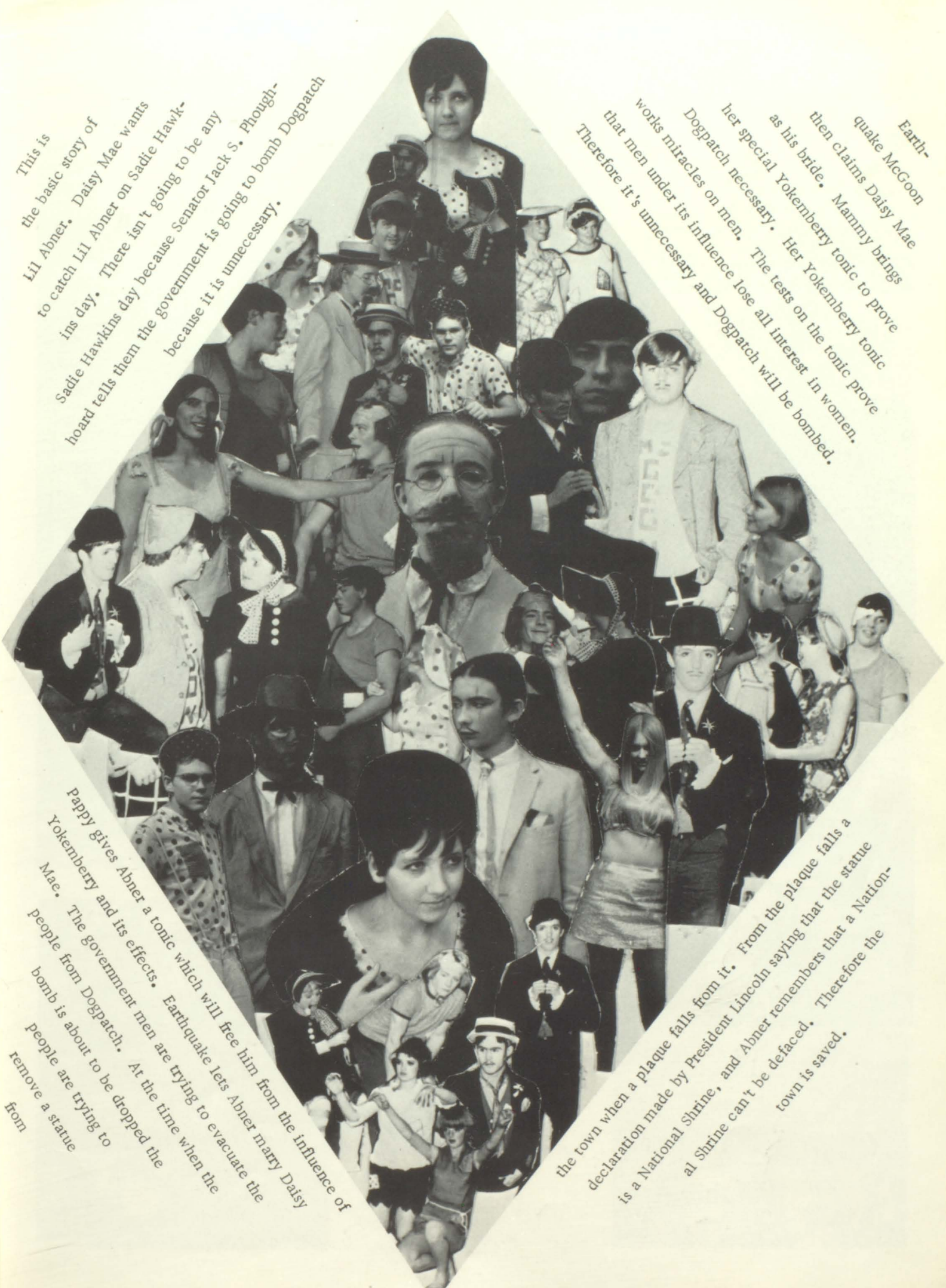
Moonbeam McSwine and the Dogpatch Girls
