SUPERINTENDENT'S MESSAGE

Hyannis High School is one of twenty-four Class VI School Districts in the State of Nebraska. By definition such districts include only grades seven through twelve. Such districts usually serve their purpose best in rural areas where Class I School Districts can maintain their own separate boards and elementary schools with either kindergarten through grade six or kindergarten through grade eight. Rural schools can be maintained with a Class III District which has kindergarten through grade twelve, but even though these schools could still be maintained where they are presently, they would all be under one school board and central administration.

Very young students should not have to travel great distances daily to attend the elementary grades, and rural schools in the neighborhood often meet the needs of these children best without much time and expense enroute to and from the school site. A rural school-as any school-will serve its students about as well as the ability and dedication of the teacher or teachers who work there. If a rural school has one teacher and she or he is a very good teacher, then those students may later begin high school with a very strong background in the fundamentals that are necessary in the various courses. If on the other hand the school board for that rural school practices false economy by hiring the very least expensive and also the least capable teacher available, the several years of exposure to several such teachers during those children's elementary years may bring a student to the high school setting quite ill-prepared. The adjustment to high school with many, many more students and many, many more teachers is in itself not an easy experience for a twelve or fourteen year old child, but when you sometimes add to this six or eight years with much playing, high but unearned grades and above all lack of exposure to the lifetime, basic skills to be developed in the elementary grades, you may find a quite capable child having considerable difficulty in high school. This may well be little fault of the child, the child's parents or his present high school teachers, but nevertheless he becomes a victim of circumstances beyond his control.

In the high school setting, he may have some very outstanding teachers in their academic areas and he may have some that are far from outstanding, but at least all of his time will not be spent with one teacher year after year-whether that teacher be a strong or a weak teacher.

A good education is an asset rather than a liability, and he who chooses to economize too much on the mental development of his children, may very well pay a great price for that savings in the years to come.
