We dedicate this annual to you, Jeanne, and extend to you our best wishes for your continued success in your new career.

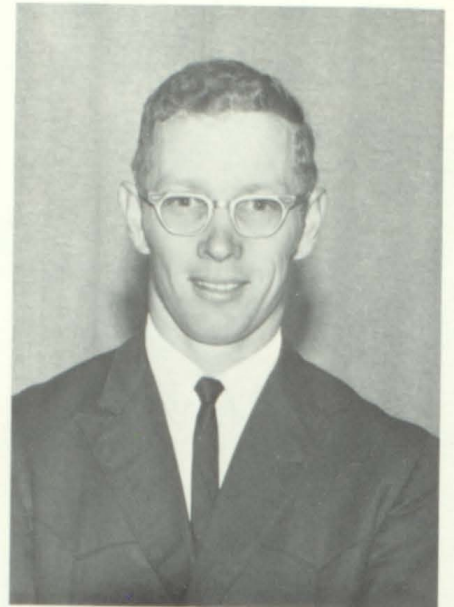

SCHOOL BOARD

SUPERINTENDENT



Only with an educated citizenry can a democratic society exist. A democracy composed of illiterate citizens could not function. First of all, in the rather elementary aspects of reading and writing, a citizen could hardly be expected to vote at all (to say nothing of voting wisely) if he could not read either the instructions or the names of those for whom he may or may not vote. Partly for this reason, our forefathers realized the necessity of providing for the support of public education in this country in the years to come. Education was considered a state function, and land was set aside to provide funds to support the common schools.

Today, schools, educators and other taxpayers are still continuing to attempt to provide more and better opportunities for all children to develop to their optimum potential. Some capable students will learn much in spite of what the teachers do and others will learn very little regardless of what the teachers try. Yet, new methods and programs are helping because today we have a larger percentage of our youth graduating from high school than ever before in the history of this country.

Better trained teachers and smaller, ability-grouped classes have both helped us better meet the needs of students in preparing for adult life in a highly complex and competitive, democratic society. Because of a broad range of ability and background, the more capable students in a large class are often bored and those with somewhat less ability often fail. When such is the situation, much talent may be wasted or even lost.

In our school, smaller, ability grouped classes of quite capable students have been pushed and challenged more, and less capable students have received more individual help which has produced fewer failures. With these two accomplishments in mind, we have now pursued doing more for our handicapped students so they can have more positive experiences as they prepare for adult life. Part of this development was because of state legislation requiring such and part of it was intended as a local effort regardless of legislation taking place.

Today, the trend is toward keeping handicapped students in the regular classes as much as possible, and studies have shown that such students advance better under such circumstances than when they are isolated in special classes with other such students. Having these handicapped students in normal classes is called mainstreaming. It is recommended that such students be mainstreamed at least half of the school day.

Because many of these students do have special needs that require more time and special attention, separate and additional teachers known as resource teachers are employed to give added time and attention to the needs of these students--both within and outside the regular classroom. The resource teacher for Grant County is provided by Educational Service Unit #16 in Ogallala.

Only through education and understanding of all people for all people can this country remain a strong world power rather than a socialistic welfare state.

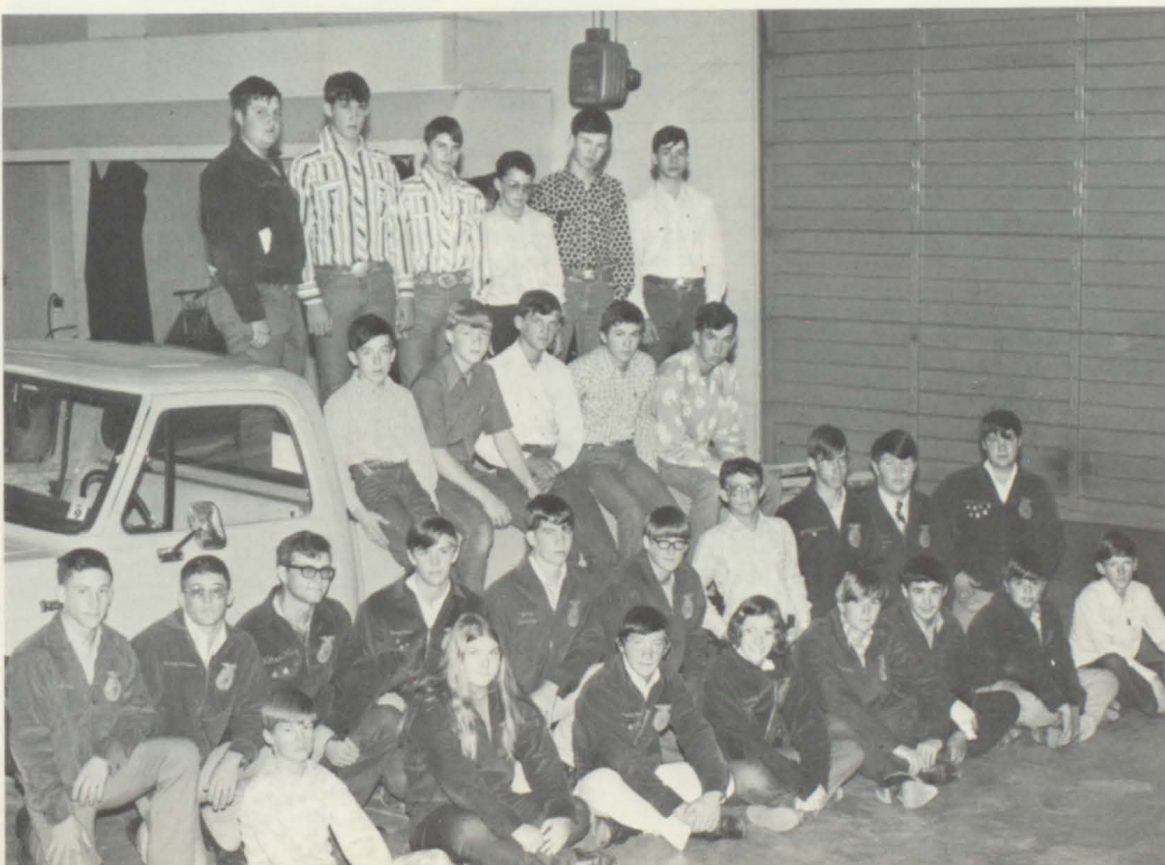

This year has been another fine and active year for Wrestling club.

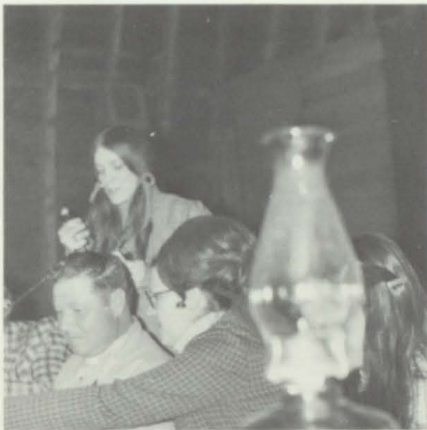
They've done plenty of good and have made more money on their money raising projects than before.

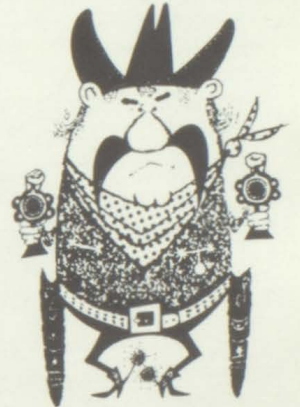

The Music Man, by Meredith Wilson, presents a picture of life in a small American town in 1912. "Professor" Harold Hill, a fast-talking confidence man, arrived in River City, Iowa. His con-game formula is to promise to organize a town band, collect the money, then quietly slips out of town. An old friend tells him that one of the main obstacles will be the librarian, Marian Paroo. Hill is not fazed. His first task is to sell the townspeople. To do this, he paints a frightening picture of the dangers of the new pool hall. How can the morals of the young men be saved? The answer is a town band. Then Hill meets Marian, and in spite of his attempts to win her over, is rebuffed. Not to be discouraged, Hill again attracts the townspeople to the idea of a town band at a Fourth of July program. He paints a vivid picture of the glories of a band and arouses great enthusiasm for the idea. All the people are sold on the band except Marian and the mayor, the latter owns the pool hall that Hill has slandered. Hill flatters the mayor's wife, a devotee of creative dance, into supporting the band and the mayor is reluctant to oppose his wife. The instruments and uniforms are ordered and Hill begins teaching the band his "think system of music." Marian, in the meantime believes Hill is lying about his education and accomplishments, and starts an investigation. She receives proof that Hill has no degree in music, and is determined to expose him as a fraud when she realizes she is falling in love with him. The mayor, still worried about business at his pool hall, sends the members of the school board to expose Hill's fraudulent scheme. Hill avoids a showdown by getting them to sing barber shop style, then slips away before they can quiz him. When the instruments actually arrived, Marian tells Hill she loves him, and begs him to leave before his fraud is found out, but he loves her and stays to take his punishment.
