## Superintendents Message



To dwell upon the trials and tribulations of the recent past would be a vain endeavor indeed, but perhaps in this bicentennial year of 1976, we should look to the rich heritage that our forefathers in their often humble circumstances provided for their future generations. After much oppression in England where the State somewhat controlled religion and where education was often for a fortunate few, the colonists looked to the New World with great hope for freedom as they had never before experienced it.

Great foresight was shown by many of our early political leaders, as they strongly stressed in early documents the need for this new country to allow religious freedom for its people to worship as they chose without fear of governmental restraints and abuse. In the past few years, there has been a great increase of governmental interference in numerous areas by a government that at its birth guarded so heavily against this very type of control by the government. In nearly every facet of the daily lives of Americans today there is more and more control and regulation by the government with more heavy taxation required to finance such.

Another area of great foresight by our forefathers was that of education. Early leaders saw fit to set aside sections of land to provide the finances for the common schools, as they were called, where all could receive
some education for a better life and for participation in the democratic affairs of the new nation. Here again, the federal govermment was not to be greatly involved, and this function was left to the states which provided for local school boards. Today, the situation has greatly eroded in many schools, and into receivership. Although the situation there may have been indeed bad, a healthy precedent was not set. Much of the trouble there may have been directly related to governmental interference and regulation along with previous court rulings. Federal judges, through their rulings on busing, integration and many other significant areas of education have greatly changed the structure and the outcome of all the schools of America by greatly affecting the daily lives of parents and children--often against their better judgment and that of their elected leaders.

The school has more responsibility in many areas than ever before, but its authority to act is being constantly eroded. Negotiated union contracts with personnel, rulings by federal judges and courts along with some legislation adopted by state legislatures are all hampering the American educational system to the extent that it might not well survive to meet the needs of a society by which it was so capably established. Educational achievements and standards as well as other freedoms and tolerance must be maintained if this democracy is to stand strong enough to reach future anniversaries of this bicenntennial as a world leader.

It is my hope that the students of Myannis High would make the greatest use of their opportunity to acquire an education and avoid many of the disappointments of accidental discovery.
