


#### **Juniors**







## **Faculty**





Sydney Mickelson teaches English, and has been the junior class sponsor for two years.


Gene Miller teaches Vo. Ag., Diesel Mechanics and has been the FFA sponsor for twelve years.






## **Honor Society**

#### **Journalism**

















### H.S. Football




# **H.S. Volleyball**














# J.H. Wrestling




