

Brown ends career; Craig breaks takedown record!

The Hyannis wrestlers, coached by Bryan Wilson, doubled in size from last year going from 3 wrestlers to 6 this year. There were two freshman wrestlers this season, 1 sophomore, 2 juniors and 1 senior. Peter Schreurs wrestled at 103 and ended the season at 1-12, Chris Brown wrestling his last year in high school finishing the year at 15-6 and placed first at districts and 5th at the state wrestling tournament. Randy Craig wrestled at 145 at the beginning of the year and after Christmas break dropped down to 140. He finished the year at 22-8. He placed first at districts and 4th at state. Ethan Schreurs wrestled at 160 this year and ended the season with

a 6-16 record. Abe Wilder a newcomer to the wrestling program showed great enthusiasm coming off a broken leg mid way through the season and finished the season with a 11-12 record, Abe placed 4th at districts and 6th at the state wrestling tournament. Freshman Mike Botts wrestled the Heavy Weight Division and ended the season at 0-8. Randy Craig surpassed Chris Brown's old record for takedowns in one year (41) by racking up 50 takedowns. 
Junior High Football






Jess Cole Memorial




Weights and P.E.


Computers

WORLD NEWS

The 1991-1992 World News covered everything from constructing Biosphere 2 to the tragic news of Magic Johnson. On September 14, 1991 Carolyn Suzanne Sapp from Honolulu, Hawaii was crowned Miss America. On July 11, 1991 the moon slipped over the sun in the celestial ceremony of the eclipse, turning day into night for thousands of viewers and scientists. Magic Johnson, whose beaming smile and sparkling play entertained basketball fans for more than a decade, announced in November 7, 1991, that he had tested positive for the AIDS virus and was retiring. Johnson, whose given name is Ervin, received his nickname from a Lansing, Michigan, sportswriter after a 36-point, 18-rebound, 16-assist performance in high school. Mark Rypien was named MVP of the Redskins 37-24 Super Bowl victory over Buffalo on January 26, 1992. Most of the evening was spent completing 18 of the 33 passes for 292 yards and two touchdowns. Don Mattingly received national attention in August 1991, for more than his baseball expertise. A flat refusal to get a haircut resulted in his being benched just before the New York Yankees game against Kansas City. President Bush and former Pres-

idents Carter, Nixon and Ford joined Reagan in the first gathering ever of five past or current Presidents to open Reagan's presidential library. After all the twists, turns and tension, the closest of World Series ended in the closest of games. The Minnesota Twins Jack Morris squeezed past the Atlanta Braves 1-0 on pinch hitter Gene Larkin's single in the bottom of the 10th inning October 27, 1991, to win Game 7 and end Baseball's most dramatic odyssey. A sealed structure of steel and glass will be "home" for two years to four men and four women. The structure called Biosphere 2, is about the size of 2 1/2 football fields and contains all necessities of life. For two years, nothing will be introduced to this environment from the outside.
