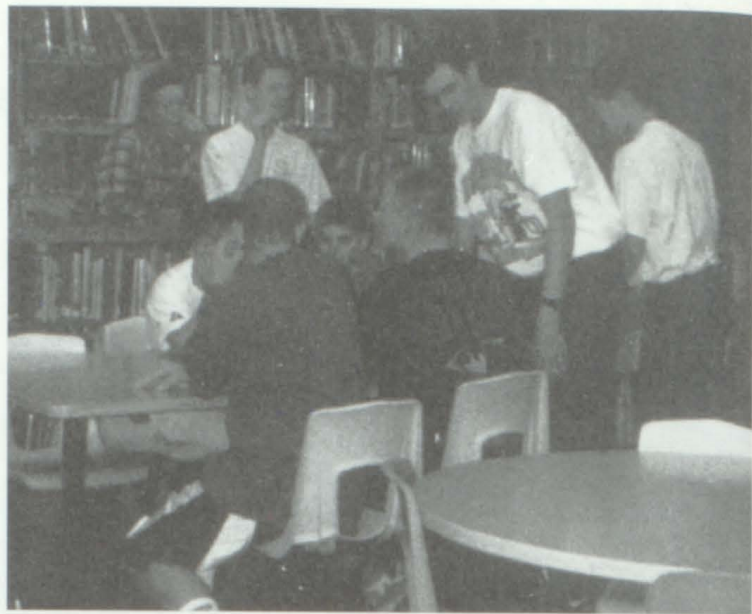

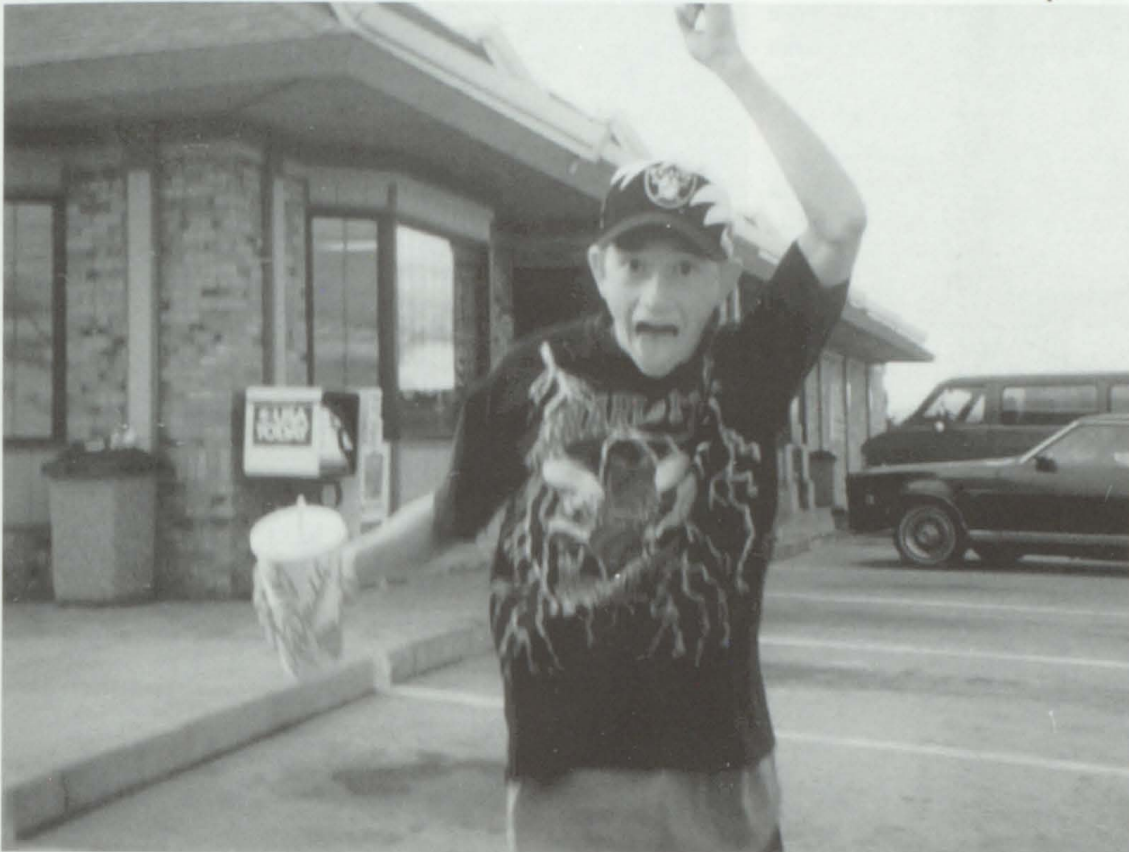

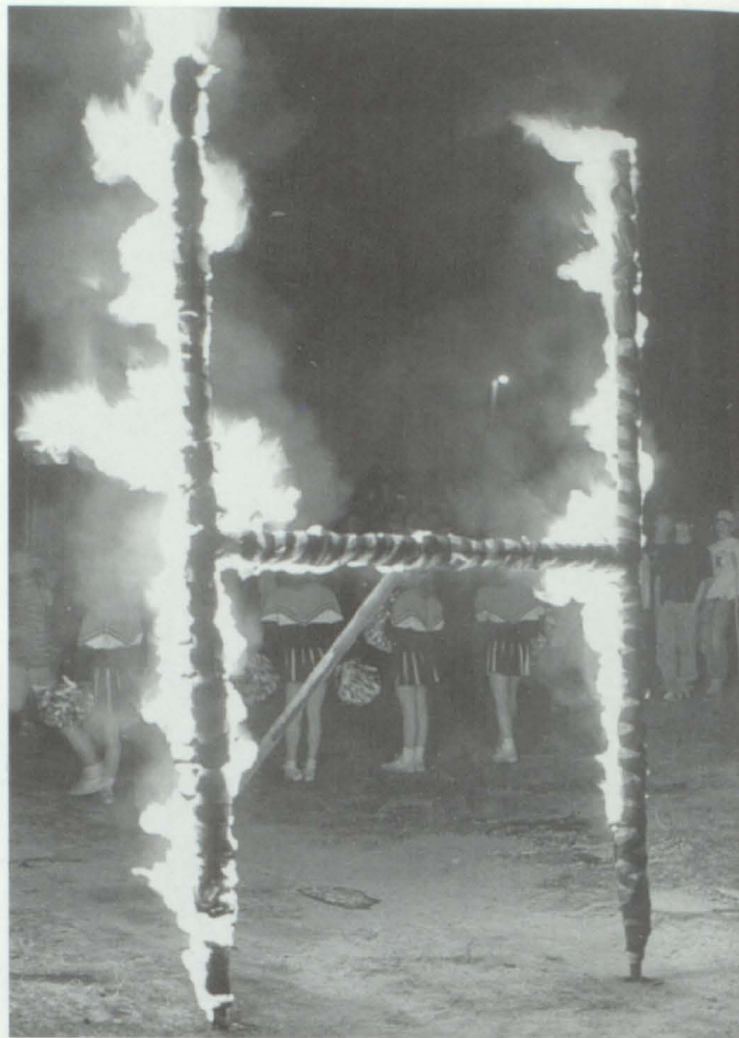


Homecoming 1994

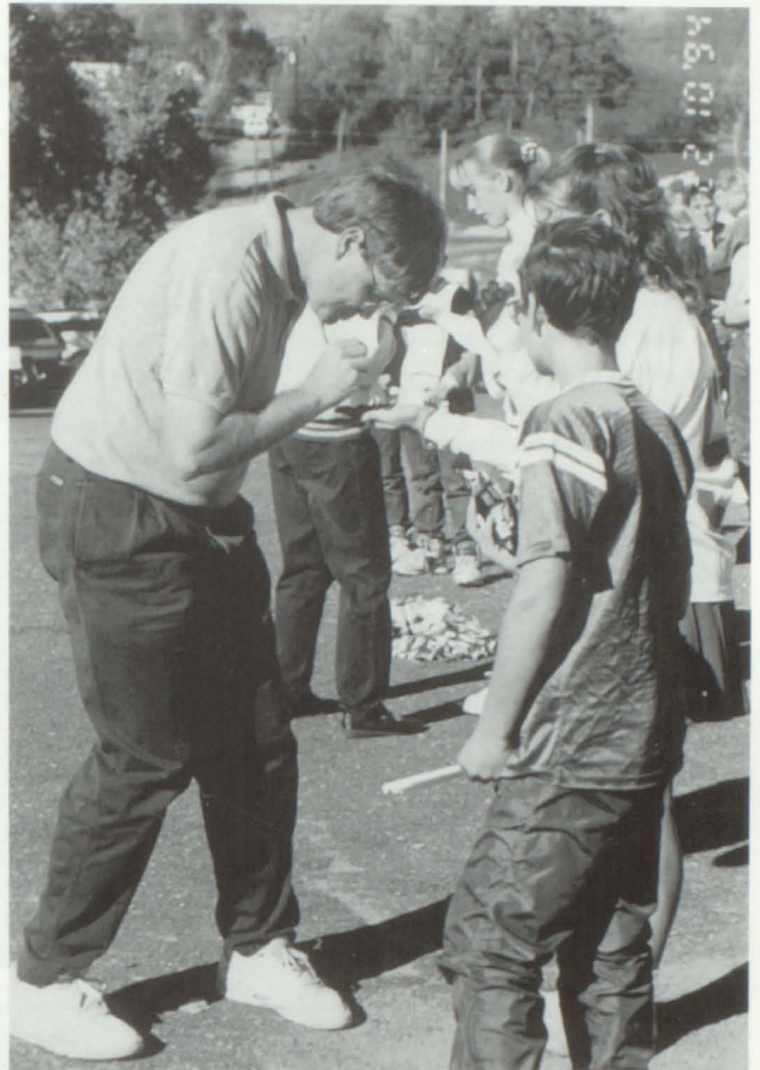

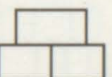

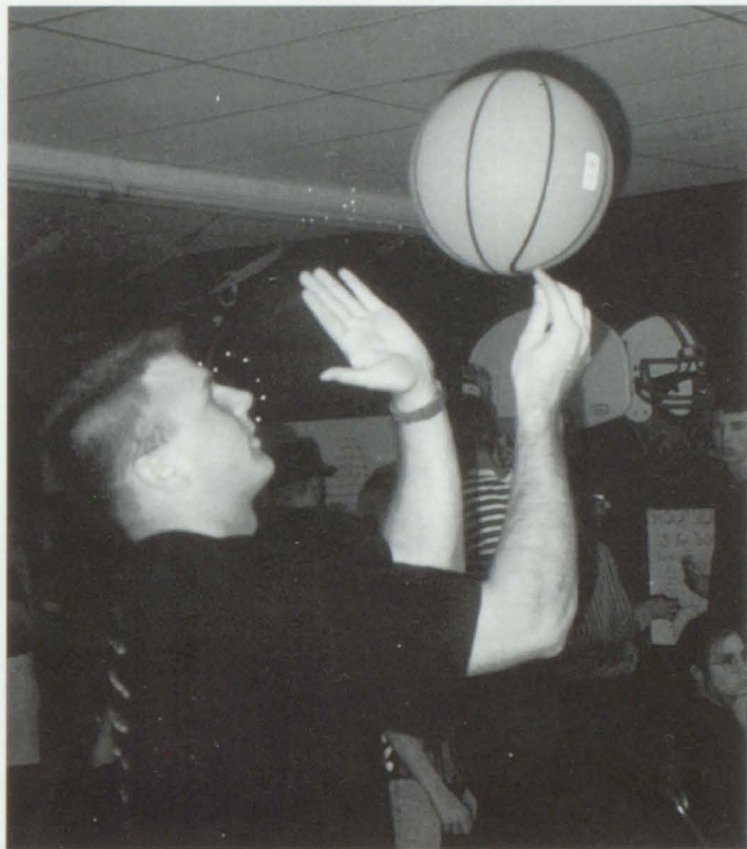


Big Red Bash

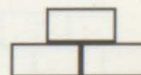

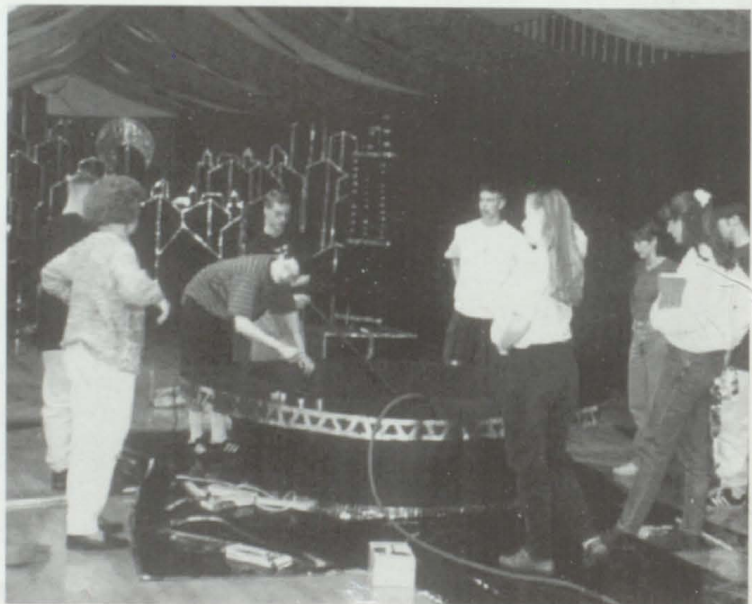

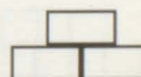

Young Dracula

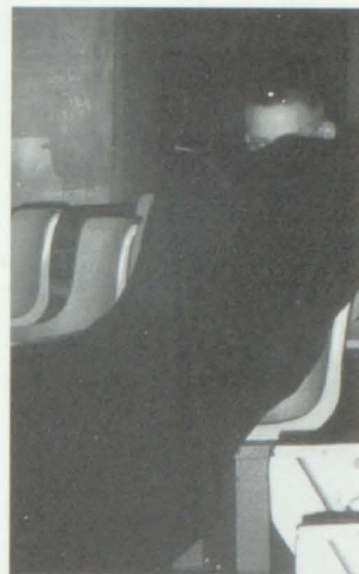

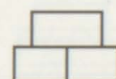

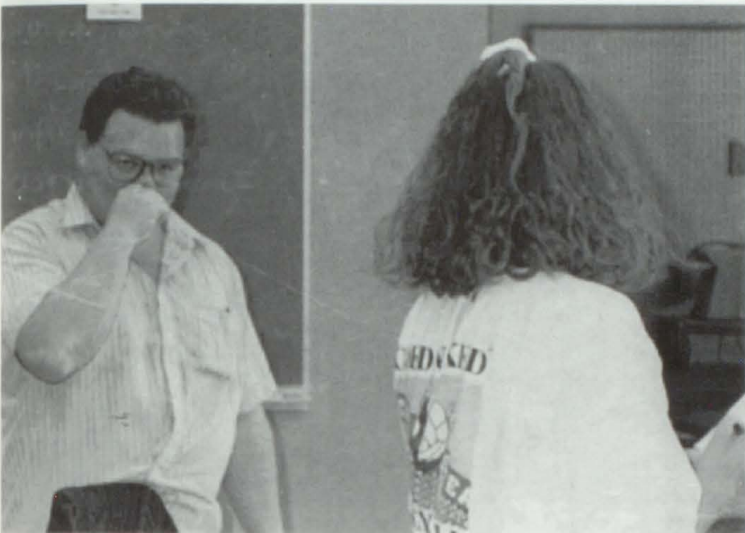

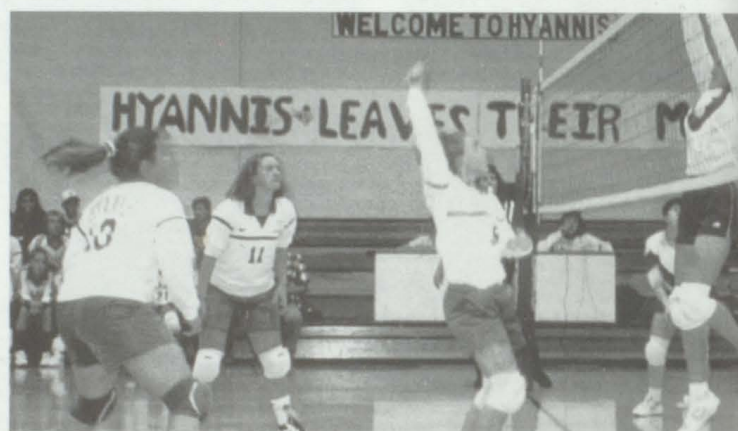
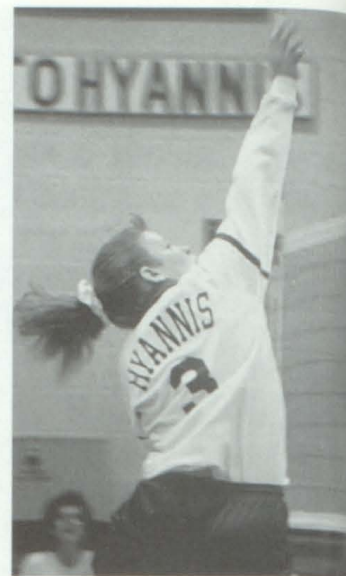
The Boundaries Came Strong for the Lady Longhorns

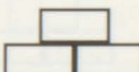

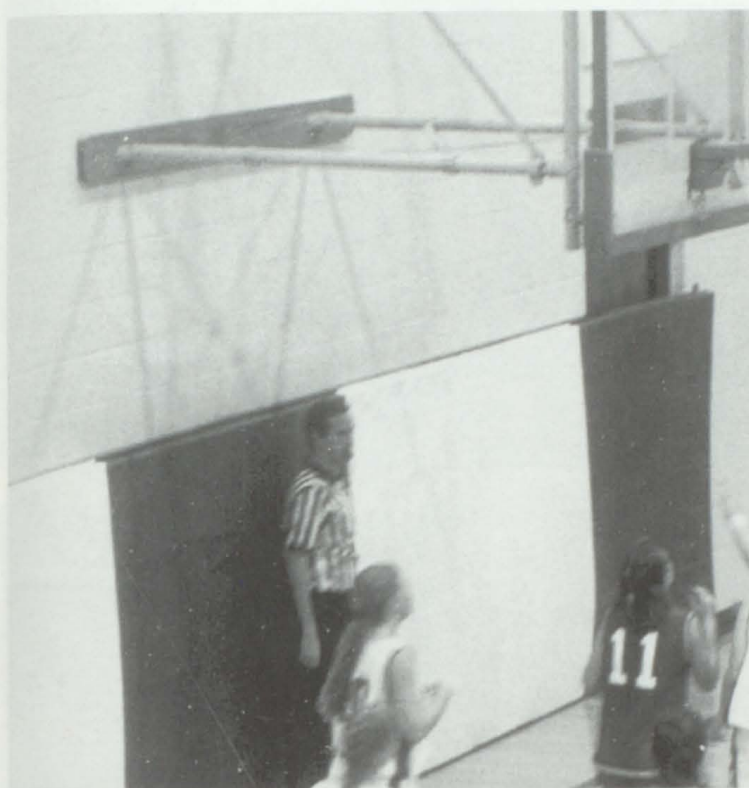

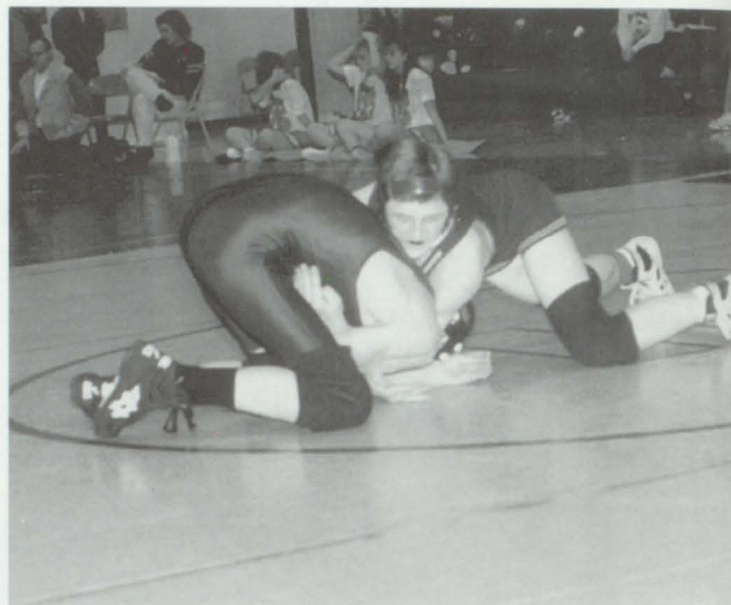
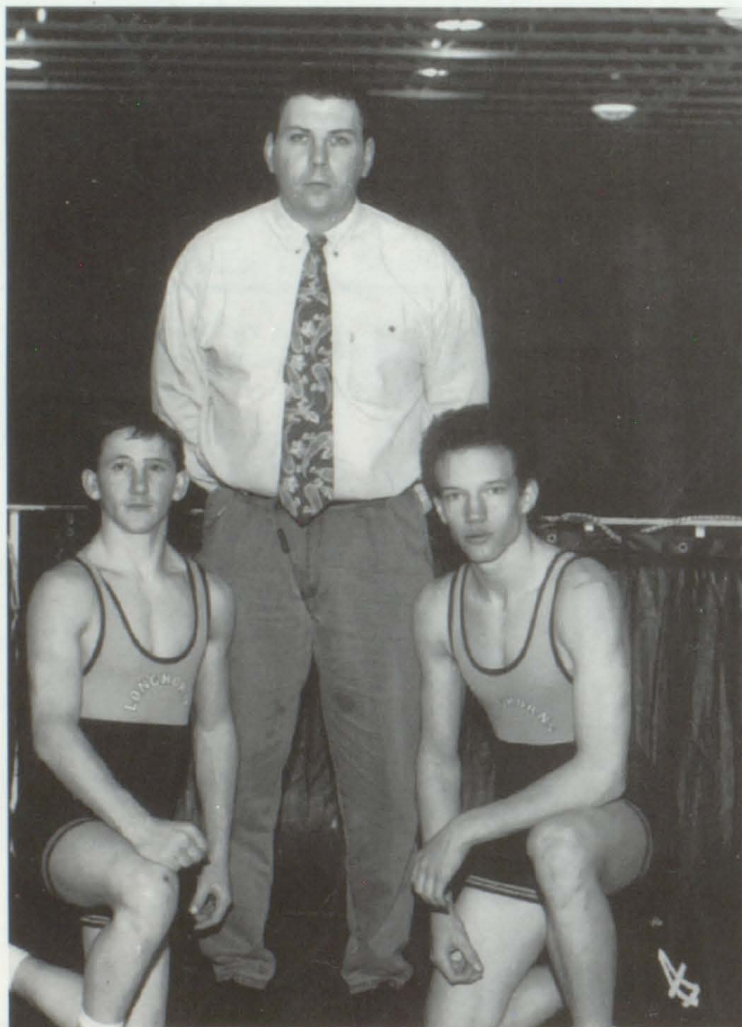
The High School Wrestling Team Shown Breaking the Boundaries

sport. The wrestlers are surely anxious for next year and more experience.

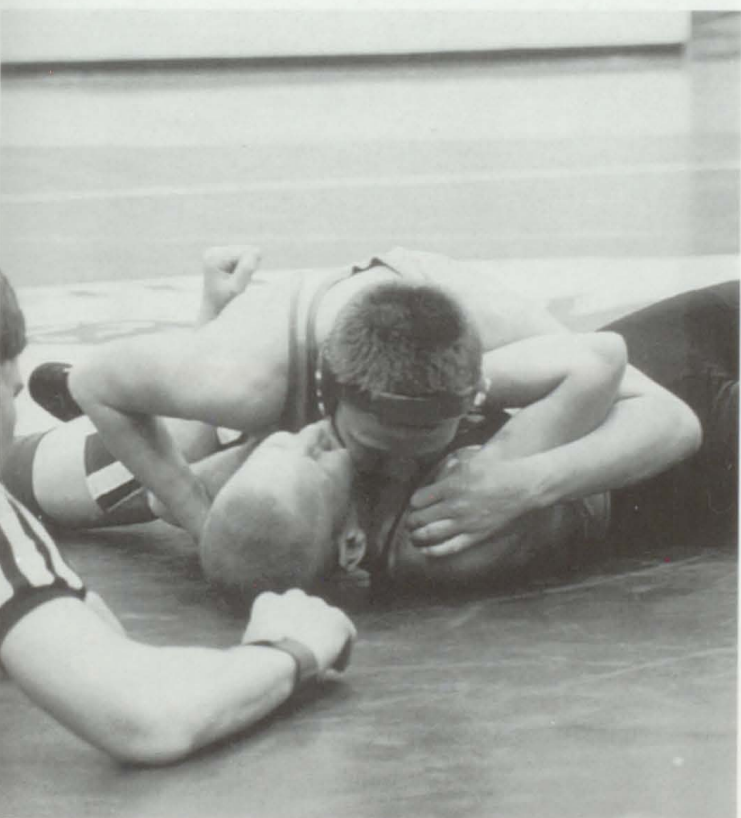
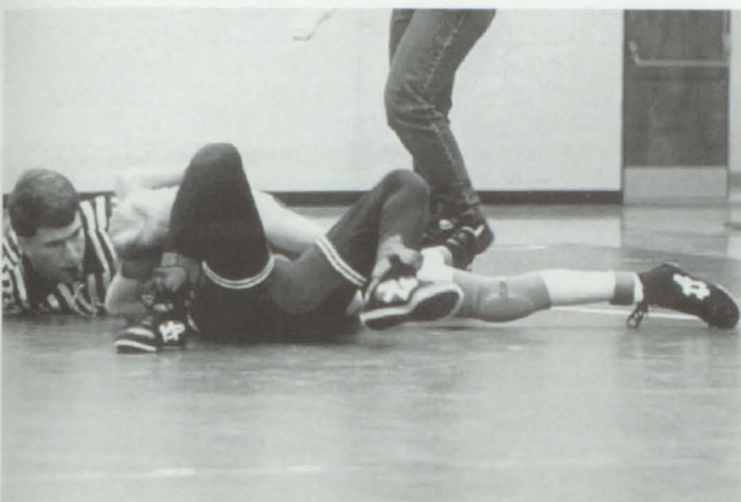

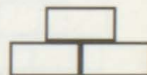

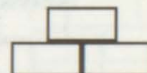

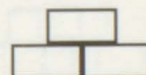

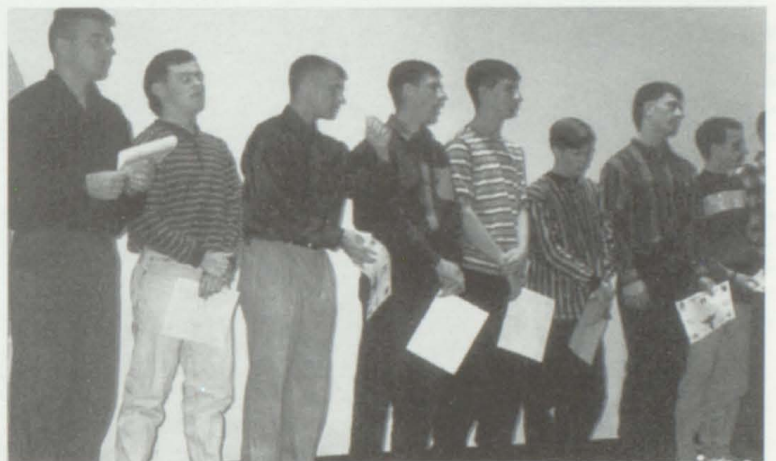

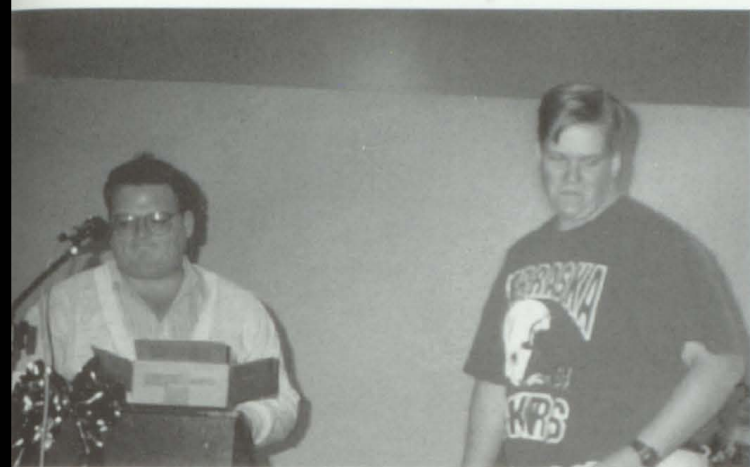
