





Friends were established at Hyannis High School and friends will depart, but still, friends will remain here. There were many differences among the class of '96 and yet they managed to build friendships.




Administration




Academics Play Major Role in Students' Lives















Longhorns Enjoy Successful Athletic Seasons


The Hyannis Volleyball team finished the season 14-3 for the 1995 volleyball season.




















Lady Longhorns Steam Roll Opponents By Kryn Kostman


