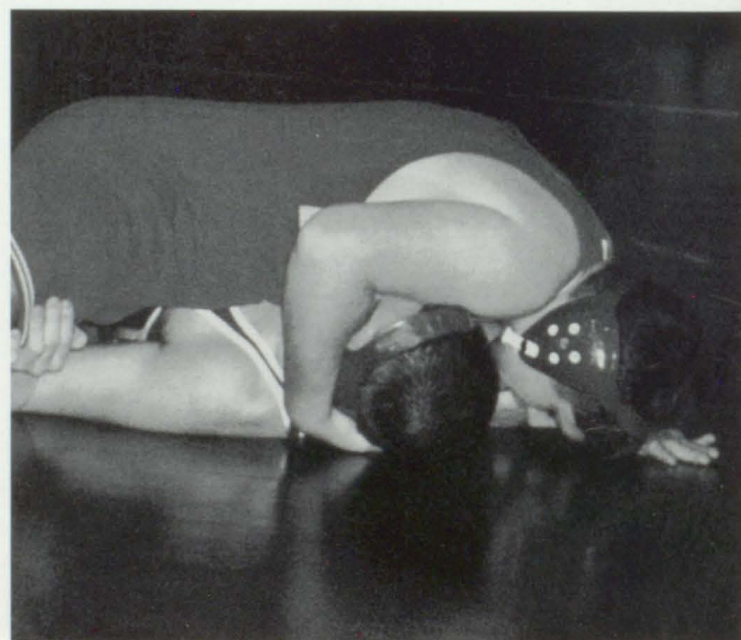

Longhorns Finish 20-2

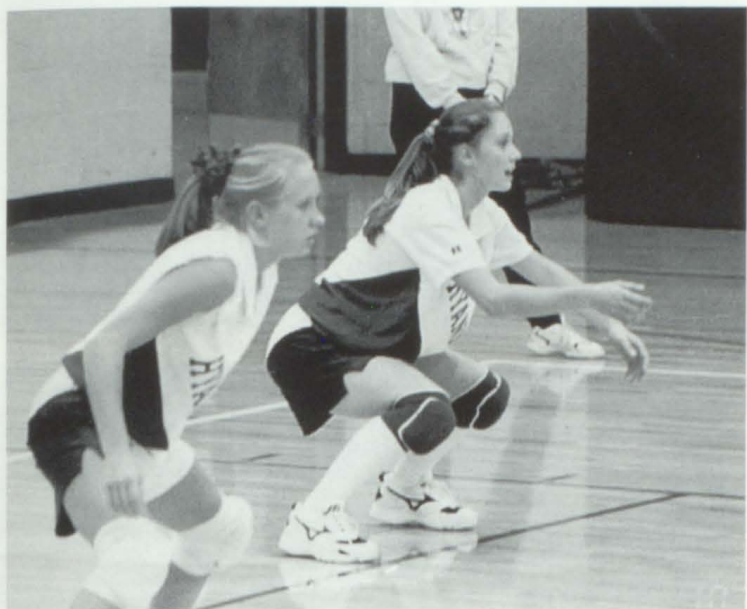
The Lady Longhorns had a strong season with their only loss coming to the state champions, Chappell. The young varsity team accomplished many of their top goals. They won O.T.C. and Sandhills Conference for the second year in a row, and for the first time in the history of HHS they won the Hemingford Invite. The junior varsity squad also had a successful season. They won the Hyannis J.V. Tournament, beating Ogallala. Lindi Meyer finished

the season serving 93%. She had 37 blocks and 119 assists. Valerie Kraus served 92% and had 111 ace spikes. Michele Keller had 123 ace spikes and 89 blocks. Kryn Kostman accounted for 103 assists. Megan Stillwell concluded with 37 blocks. To end a great season, the team had a total of 161 blocks, 385 ace spikes, and 146 ace serves. 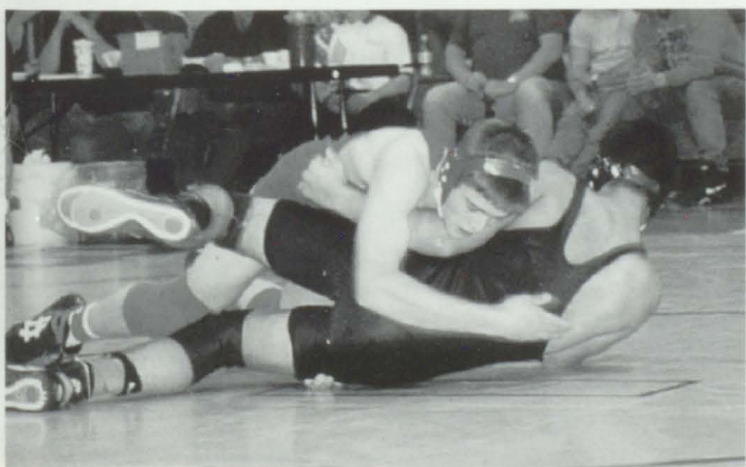
Wrestlers Have Exceptional Season

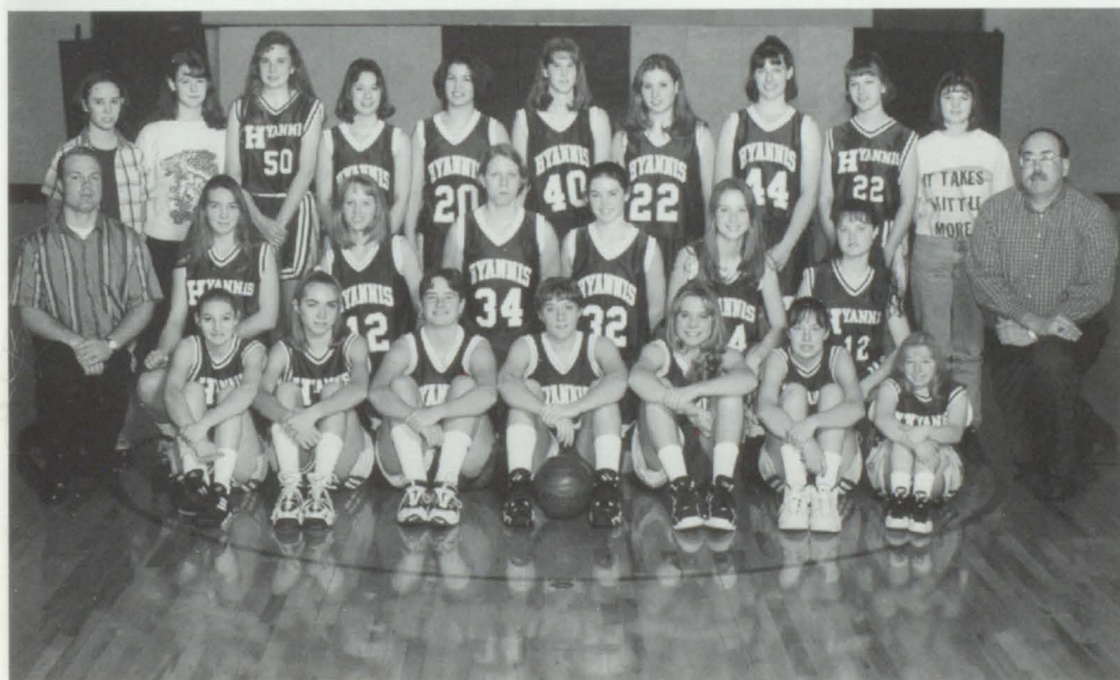


Lady Longhorns Make History

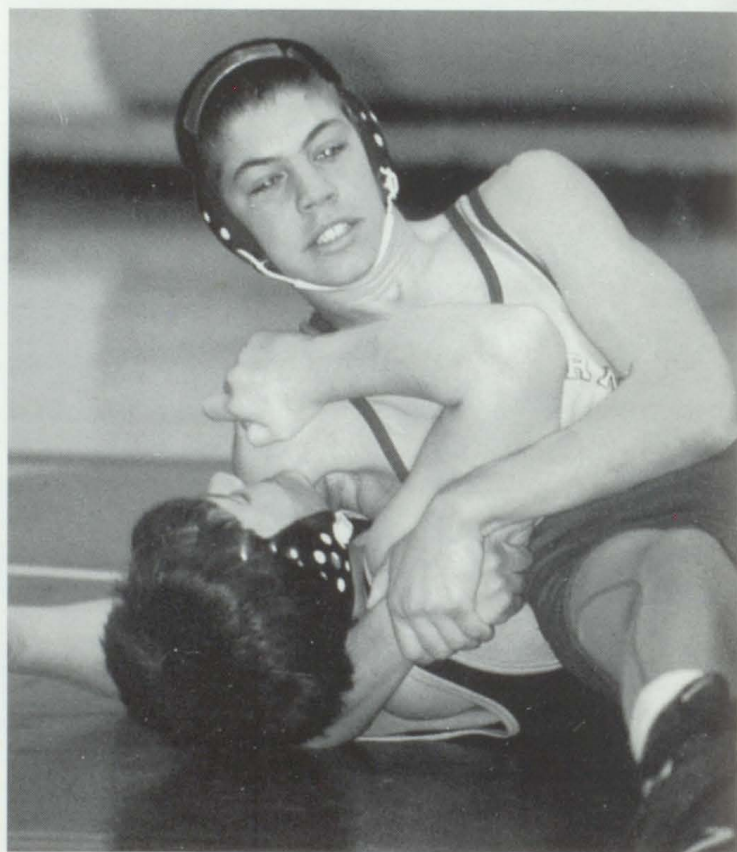

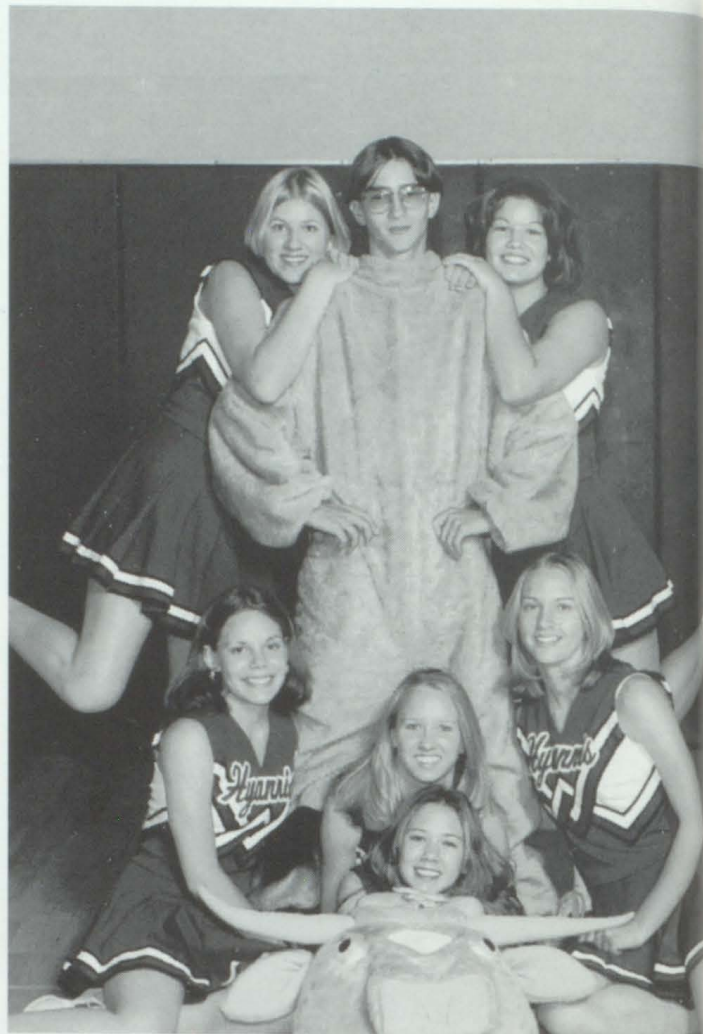
