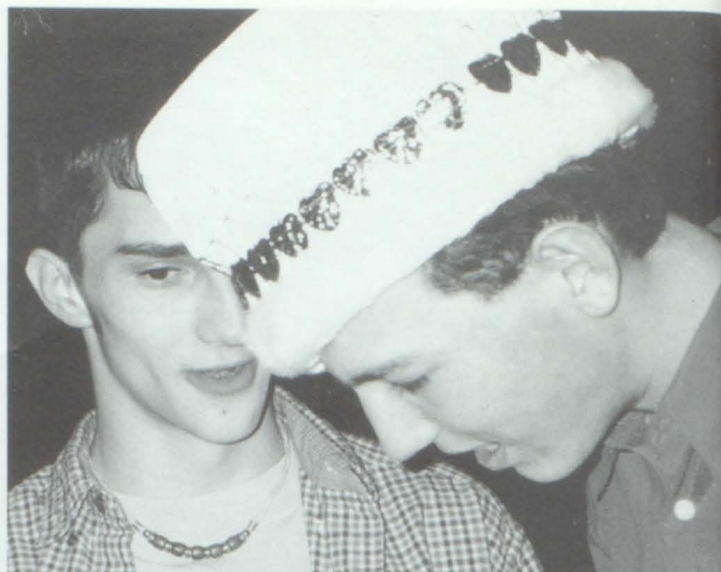

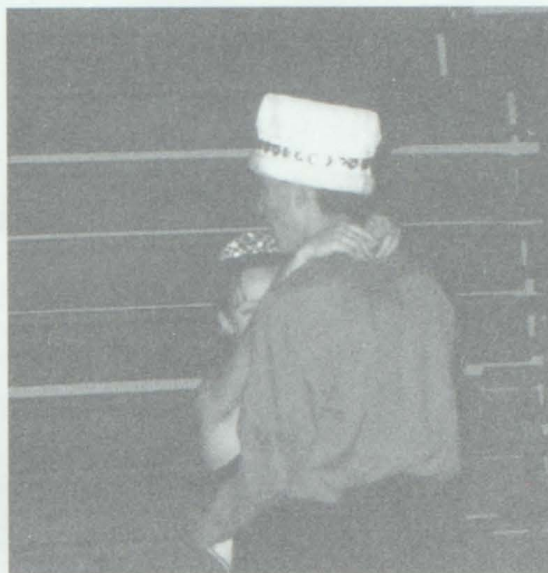


Sweetheart '99

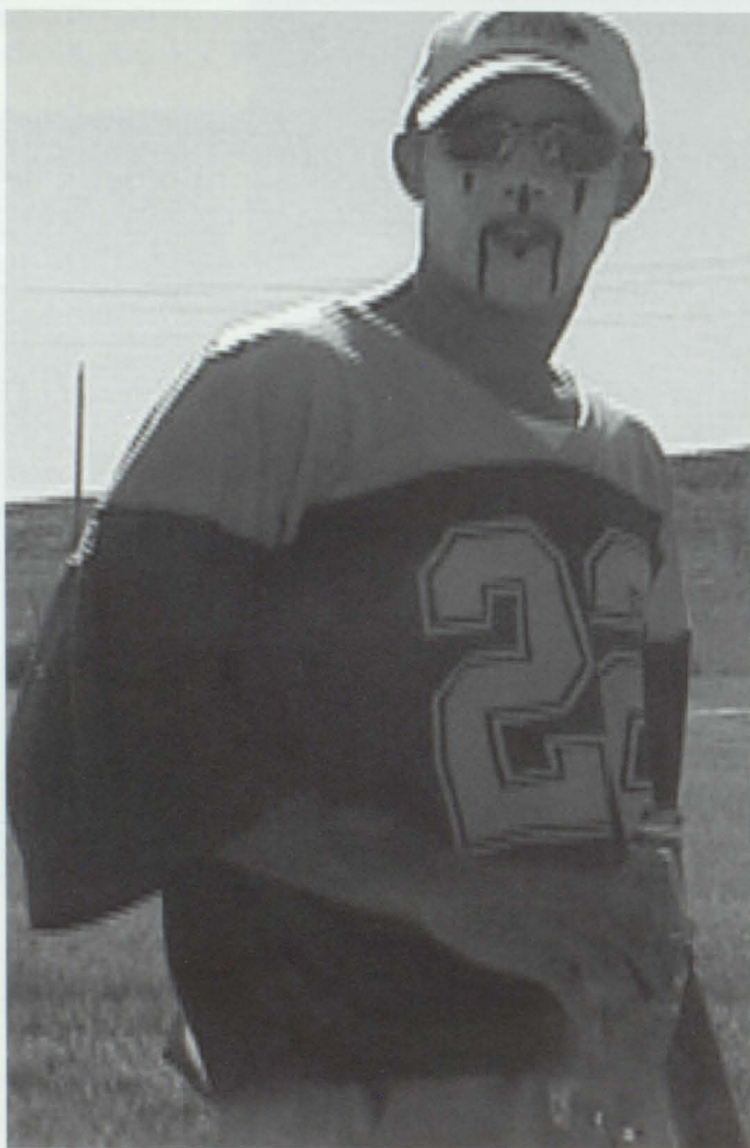

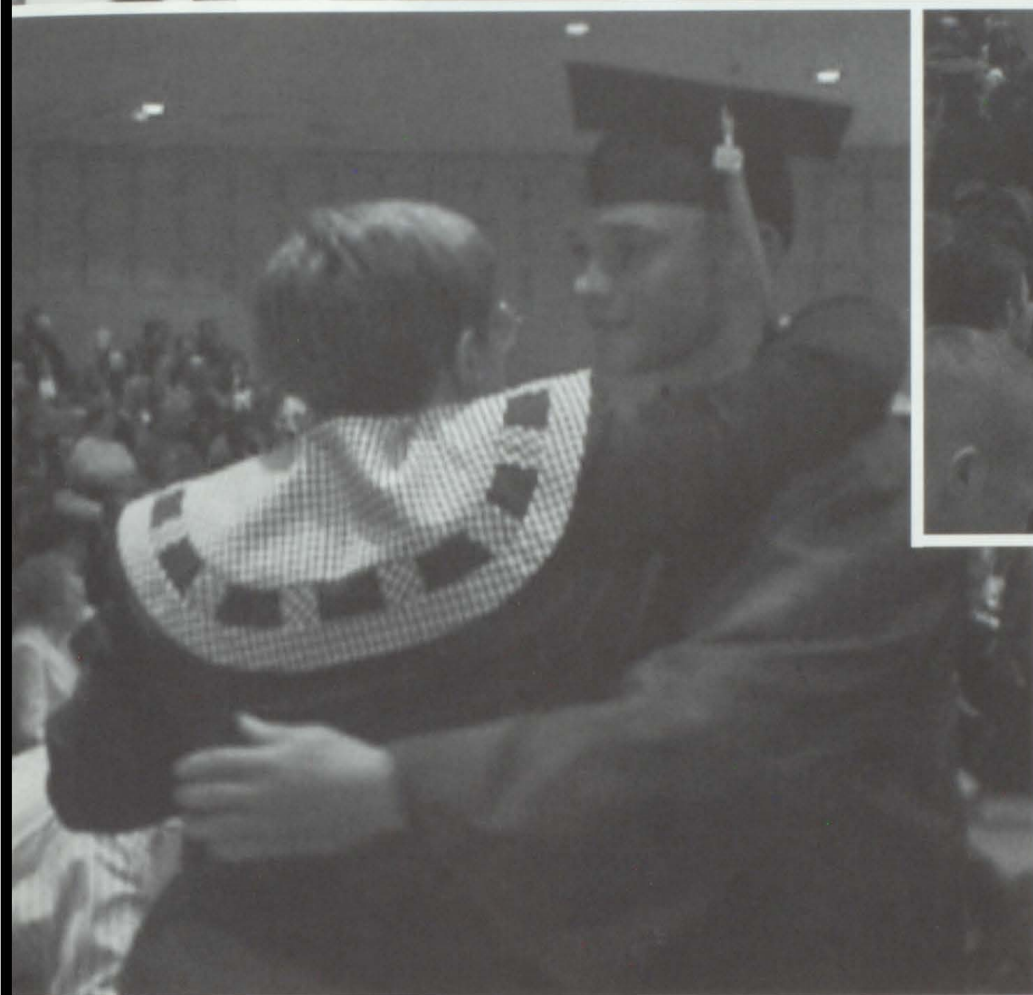
Immediately after the crowning, the dance began in the gym. This year the juniors decided to change things and hire a band to provide the music. The band was Flannel Sunday.



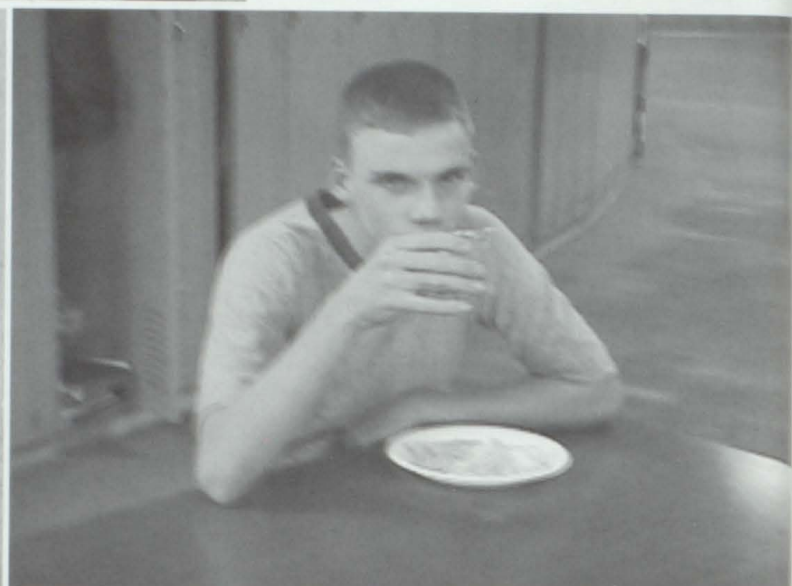
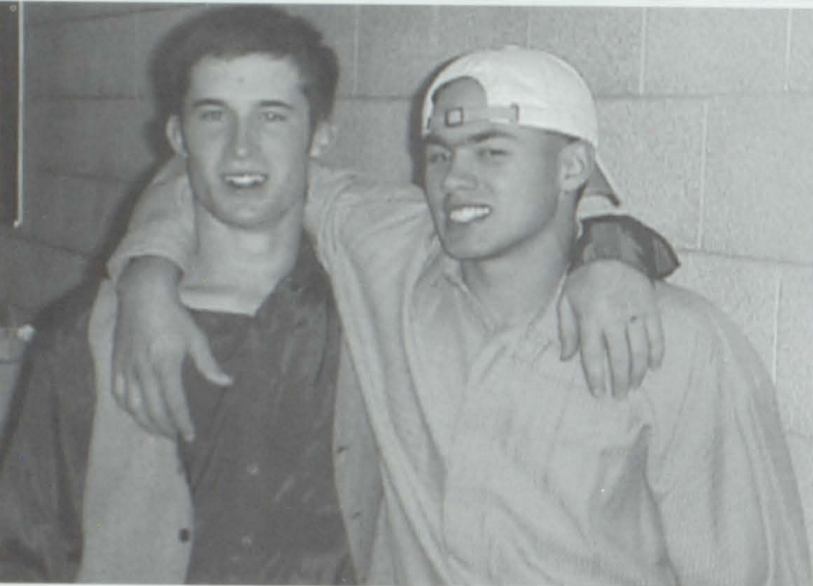

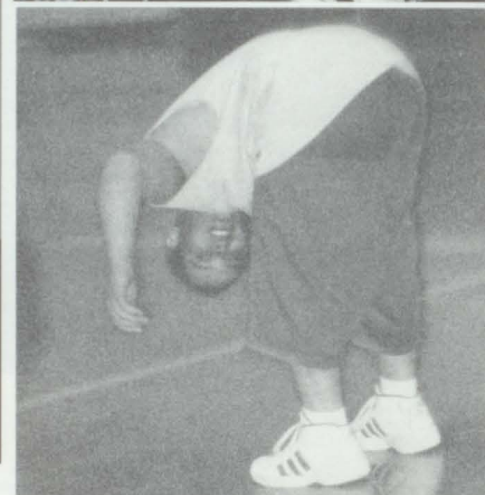
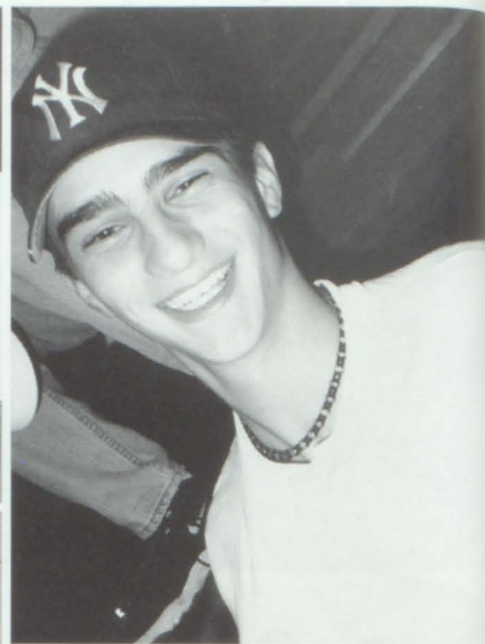


Athletic Banquet

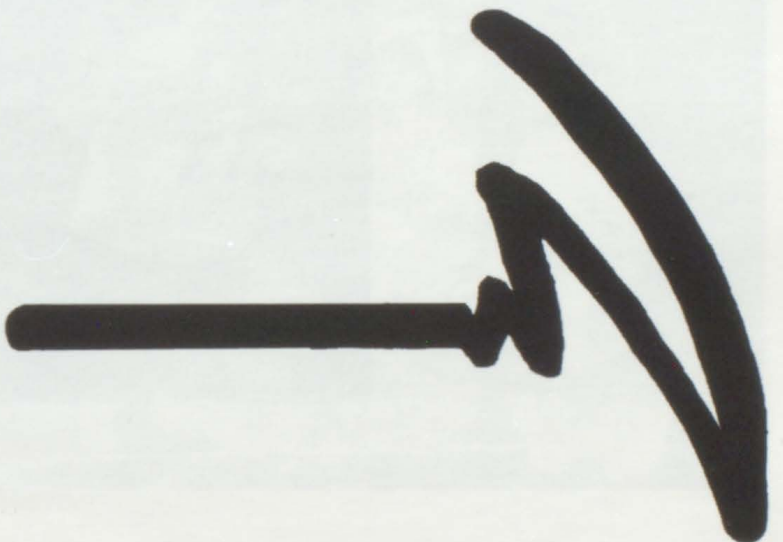

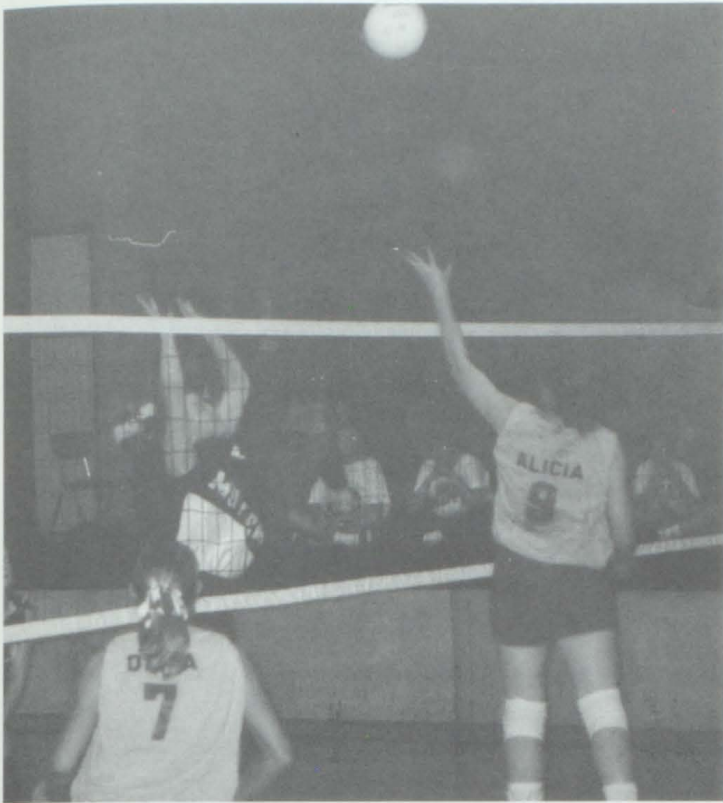
Volleyball Goes 22-1

In Coach Jepsen's third and final year, the Longhorns finished with a respectable record of 5-3. Though the Longhorns faced some tough opponents, they always made the best of what was given to them.

Homecoming in Hyannis was a great night, having lost the last four the Longhorns were looking for a little redemption. The Hay Springs Hawks came to town to play a ready Hyannis team. The Longhorns started quickly and scored first, and by halftime the score was 28-8 Hyannis. The second half was a different story as the Hawks struck quickly making a game of it. The game came down to the wire, but Hyannis hung on to a victory. The key players for Hyannis were Michael Stillwell who rushed for 210 yards and four touchdowns, Brett Nason added 47 yards and Ryan Frye rushed for 34 yards and a game winning score. The final score was 34-30.

The Longhorns ended the season with 1,981 total rushing yards and 483 passing yards. Stillwell lead the team in rushing with 940 yards and 17 touchdowns. Scott Kraus passed 28 times for a total of 84 yards and 7 touchdowns. Justin Workman punted 809 yards and averaged 32 yards per punt. On the defensive side, Seth Adam lead the team with four interceptions and returned one of them for a score.



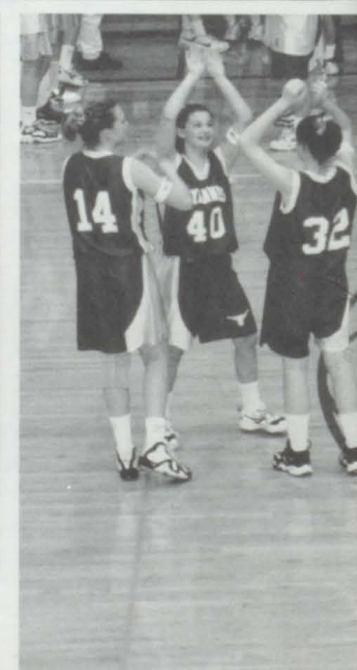

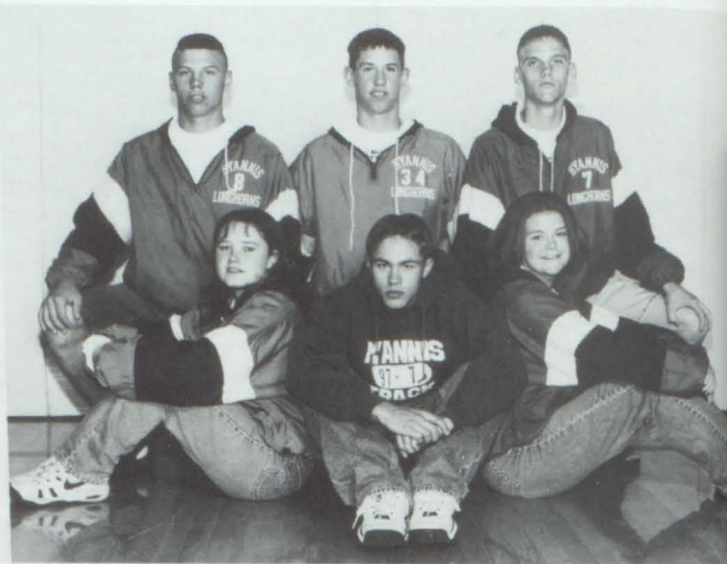

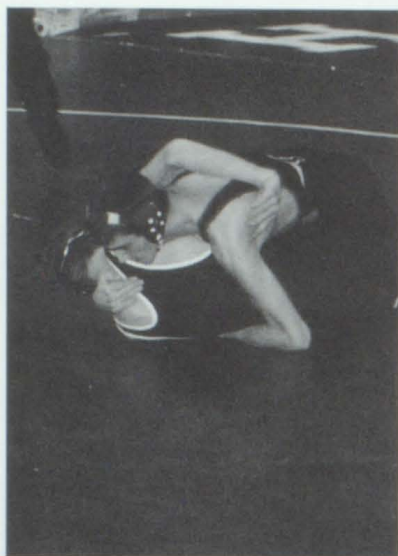

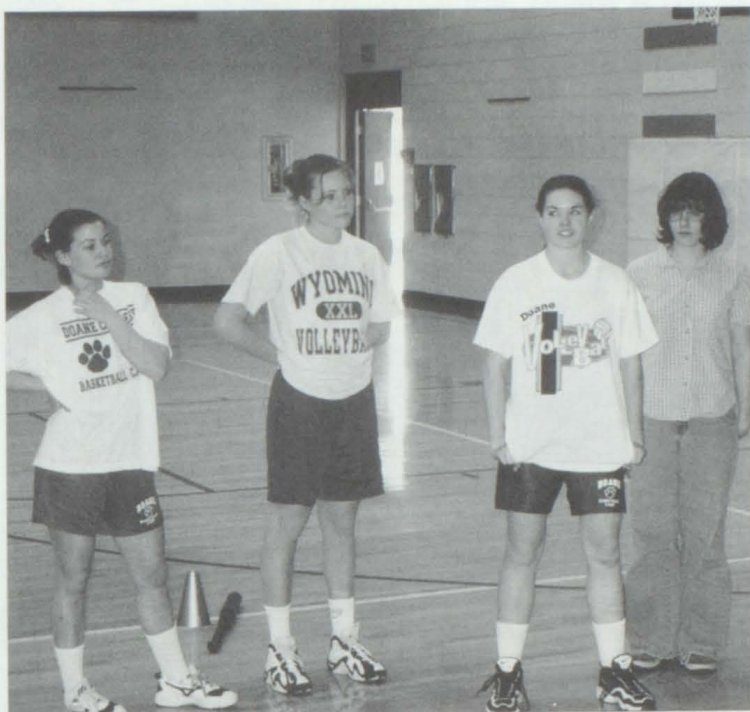

HHS Publications Find Success in '98-'99

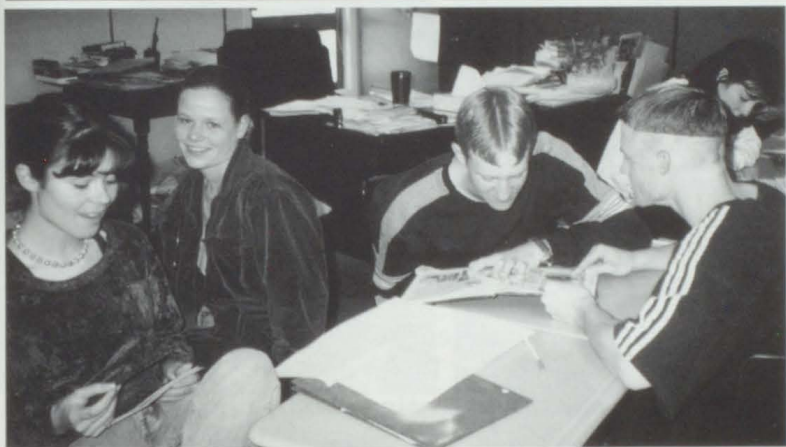

HHS High School Band

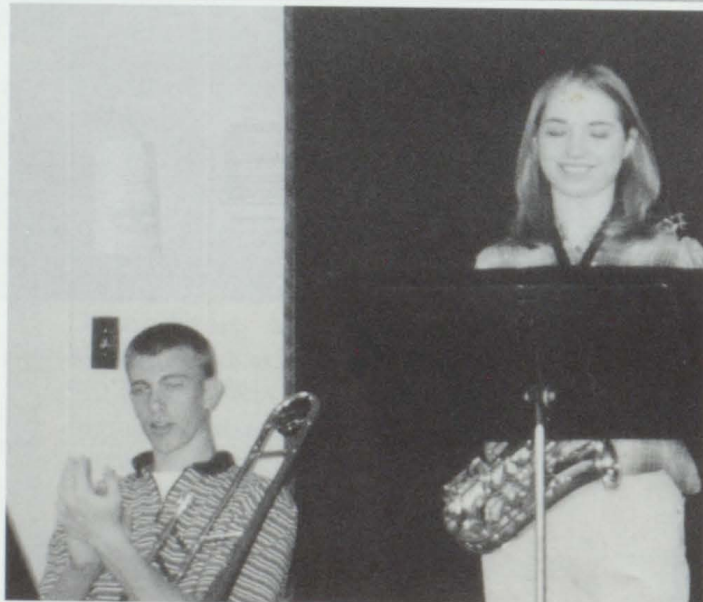
