

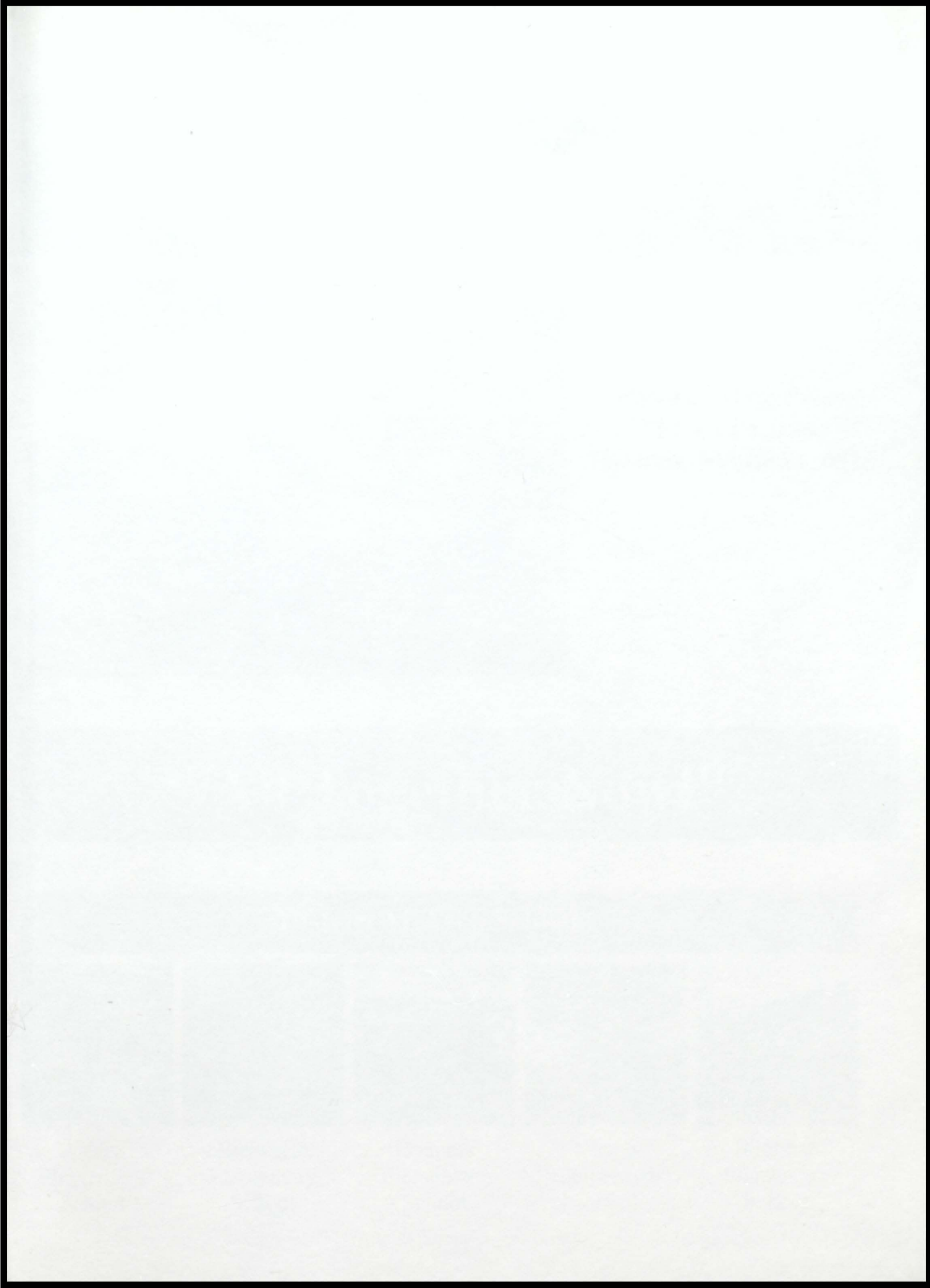

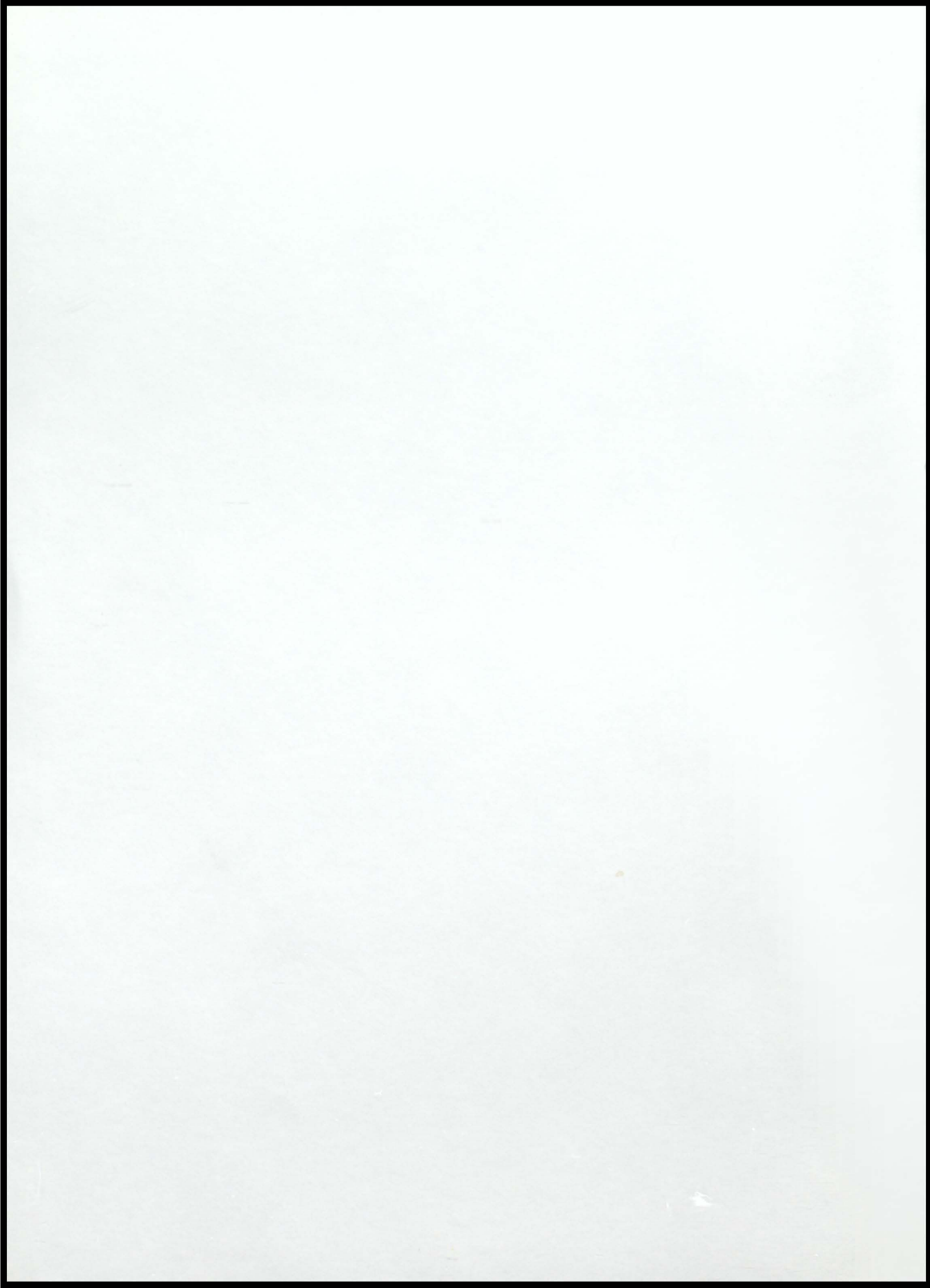

The theme for the 2007 Longhorn, "All Together Now!", came about because of the newly consolidated District 11 Area Schools.

"All Together Now!"

(1) The newly consolidated district purchased a 36 passenger yellow bus, which was immediately christened "Chub" by the HHS boys. Dennis Wilder drove the Ellsworth route delivering students to Ashby and Hyannis Elementary Schools and Hyannis High School.

District 11 Area Schools

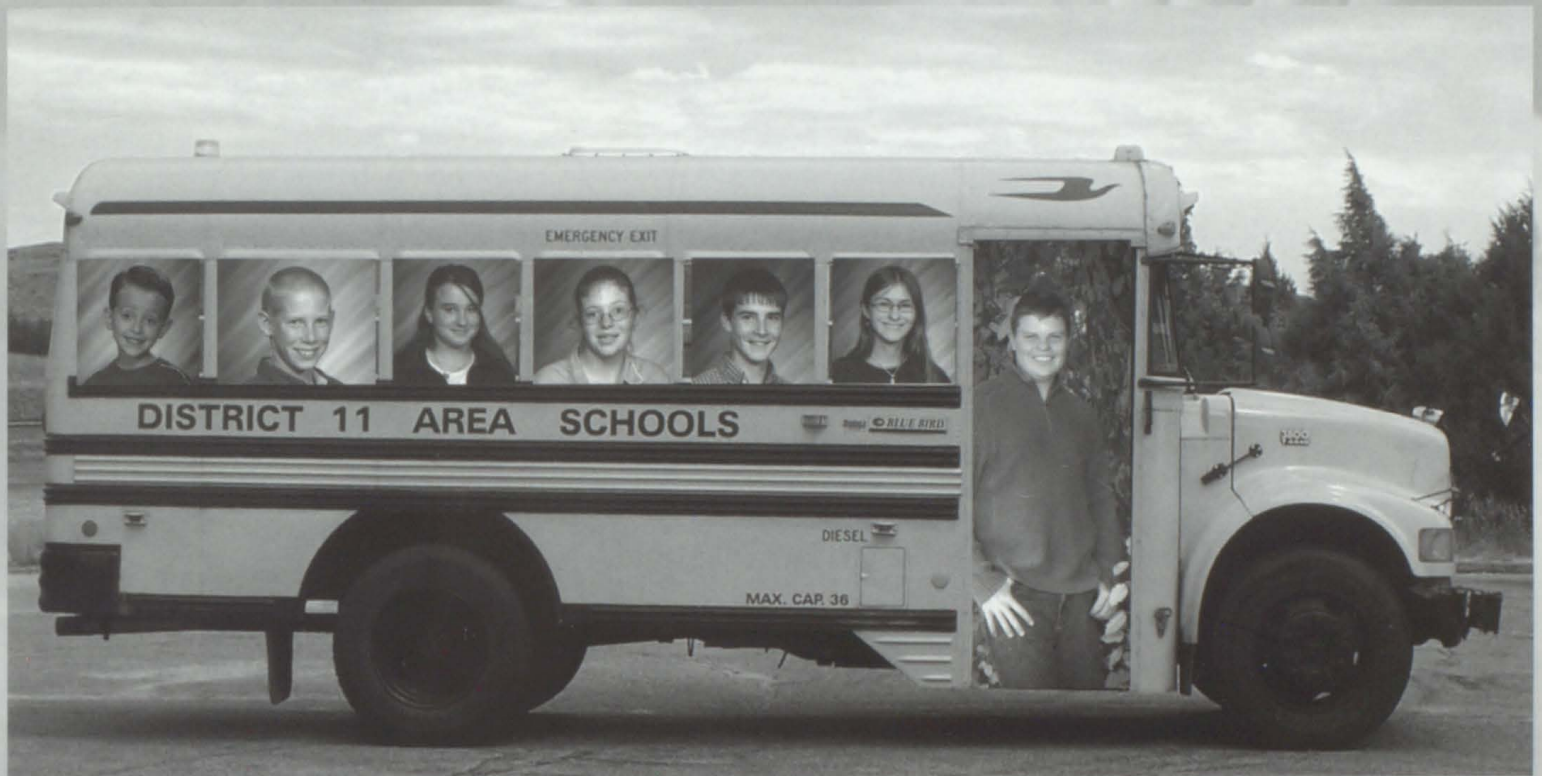
The newly consolidated district includes five elementary schools (Ashby, Ellsworth, Hyannis, Vinton, and Whitman) and Hyannis High School. K-12 students receive the benefits of certified teachers in Music and Physical Education, as much as the miles between schools will allow.

Plans for K-12 Art classes being taught by the district's certified art teacher are in the works. Possibly another bus route will be added.

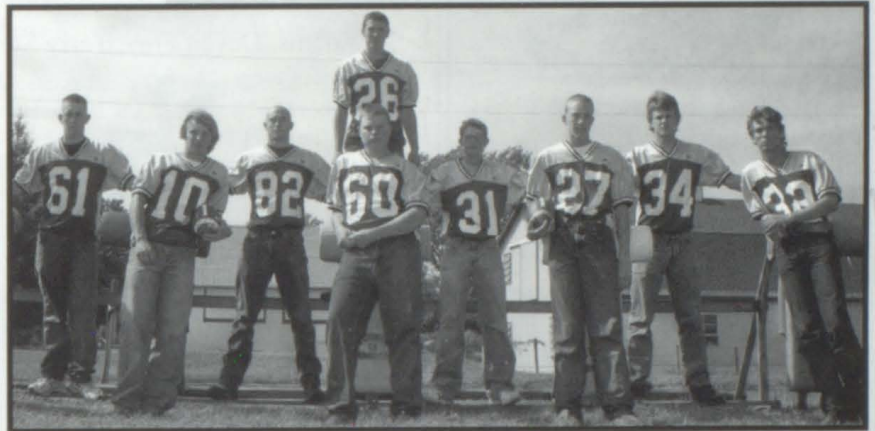

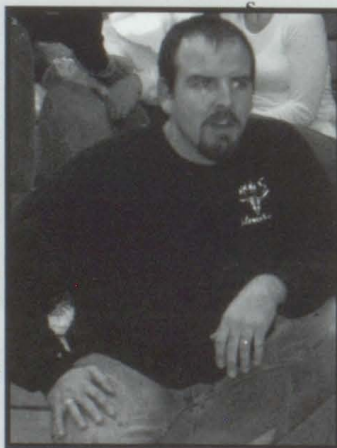

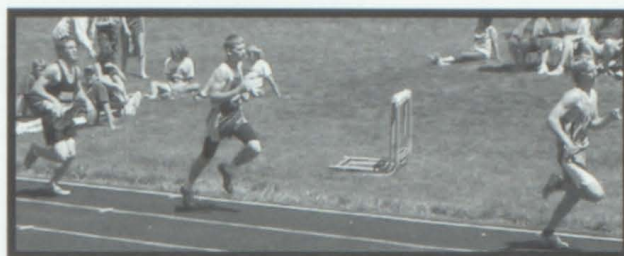

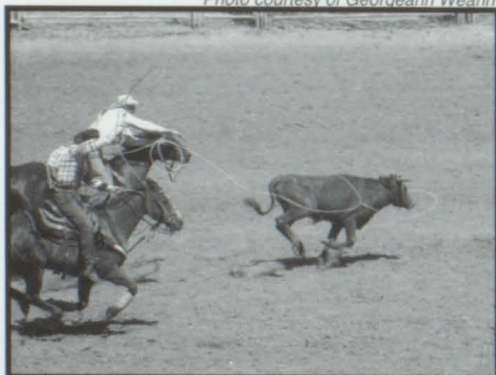

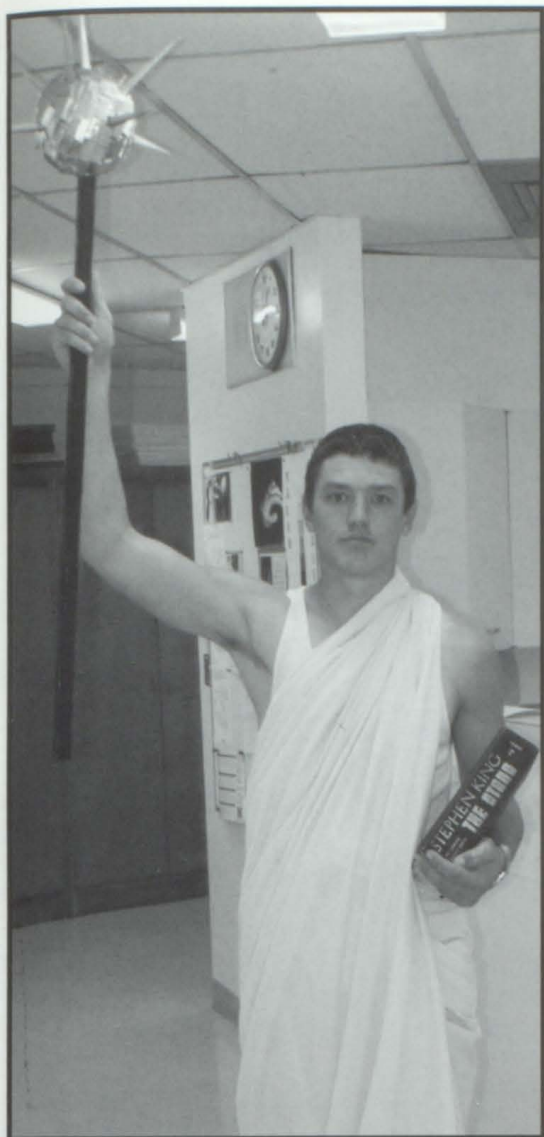

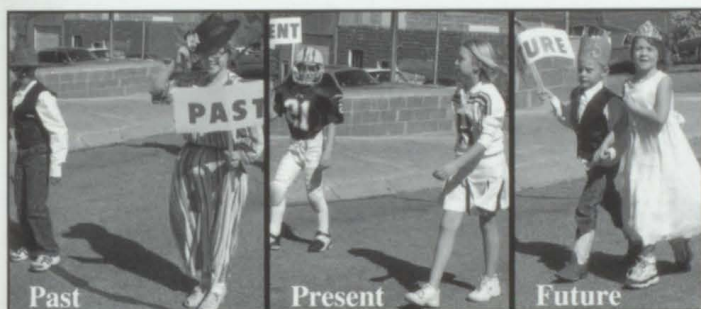

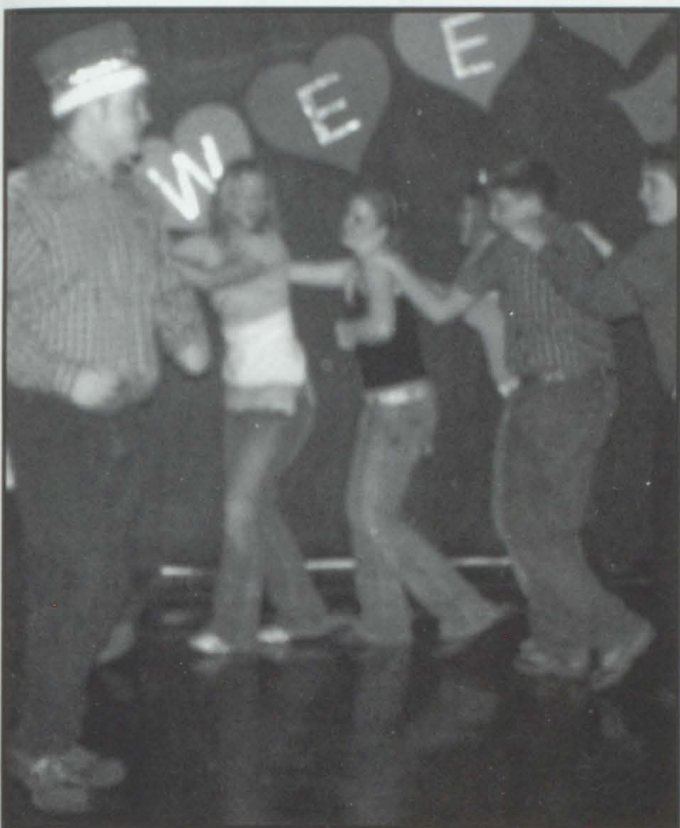
