The Hyannis Longhorns competed in two scholastic competitions during the second week in April. The first contest was April 11 at North Platte Community College. The second was on April 13 at Chadron State College.

The contest held at NPCC went well. The winner of any given contest was awarded a \$5,000 scholarship, and the top three in the contest won the opportunity to take a free class during the summer. Sierra Bixby was the only contestant from Hyannis that placed in the top three getting first overall in the Health Occupations test. Although nobody else won any prizes they did very well. Tanner Holthus placed 5/45 in Biological Science, Frannie Young placed 7/45 in Biological Science, Jessie Schwanebeck placed 4/22 in Education/ Psychology, Brianna Young placed 9/47 in Grammar Computation and 5/42 in Math, Sarah Ramsay placed 7/47 in Grammar Computation and 7/42 in Math, David Safarik tied Jacy Milsap placing 8/34 in Physical Science, and Brandy Schaack placed 11/40 in Word Processing.






Missoula Children's Theater
